- Take short breaks regularly and often.
- Perform some stretching exercises.

SCREEN POSITION ADJUSTMENT

In order to optimize the best viewing position, you can adjust the tilt of the monitor by using both of your hands to hold the edges of the monitor as shown in the figure below.

The monitor can be adjusted 10 degrees to 60 degrees up as indicated by arrow below.



* The hinge on this device may be stiff and will emit a click sound when correctly extended.

CONNECTING THE POWER CORD

- Check first to make sure that the power cord you use is the correct type required for your area.
- This monitor has a universal power supply that allows operation in either 100/120V AC or 220/240 V AC voltage area. No user-adjustment is required.
- Plug one end of the AC power cord to the adapter, and plug the other end into an AC outlet.
- For unit using at 120 V AC:
Use a UL Listed Cord Set, Type SVT wire and plug rated 10 A/125 V.
- For unit using at 220/240 V AC (outside of U.S.):
Use a Cord Set consisting of H05VV-F cord and plug rated 10 A, 250 V. The cord set should have the appropriate safety approvals for the country in which the equipment will be installed.

SAFETY PRECAUTION

- Avoid placing the monitor, or any other heavy object, on the power cord to avoid damage to the cable.
- Do not expose the monitor to rain, excessive moisture, or dust.
- Do not cover the ventilation slots or openings of the monitor. Always put the monitor in a place where there is adequate ventilation.
- Avoid placing the monitor against a bright background or where sunlight or other light sources may reflect on the face of the monitor. Place the monitor just below eye level.

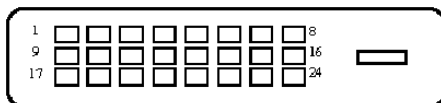

DDC

The DDC (Display Data Channel) is a communication protocol through which the monitor automatically informs the host system about its capabilities, for example, supported resolutions and corresponding timing. The monitor supports DDC2B standard.

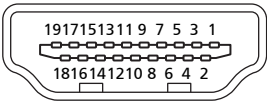

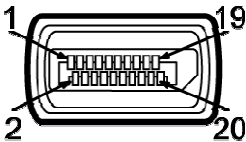

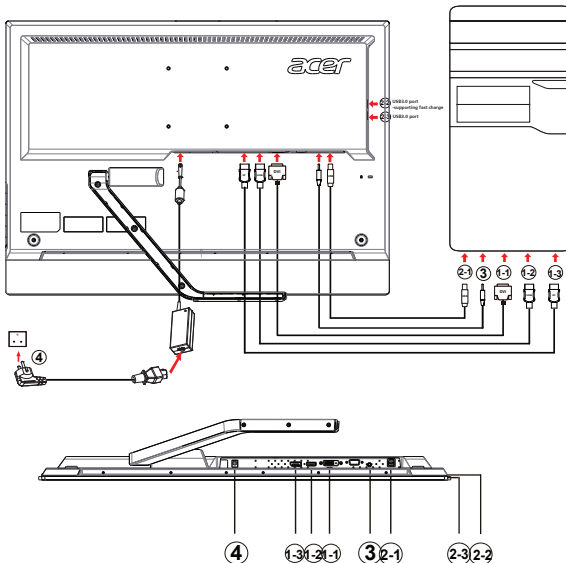

INSTALLATION


To install the monitor to your host system, please follow the steps as given below:

Steps

1. 1-1 Connect Digital Cable (Only Dual-Input Model)

 - b. Connect the HDMI cable to the computer.
- 1-3 Connect DP Cable (Only DP -Input Model)
 - a. Make sure both the monitor and computer are powered-OFF.

 - 2-2 Connect the USB 3.0 cable to port for fast charge.

Getting started with Windows 8 on your new touch-enabled Monitor

We know this is a new operating system that will take some getting used to, so we've created a few pointers to help you get started.

** Note: For the touchscreen & USB function to work, you need to connect the USB cable to the NB or PC, as well as connecting through a DVI or HDMI or DP cable.*

Three concepts you might want to keep in mind

1. **Start**

The Start button is no longer available; you can launch apps from the *Start* screen.

2. **Tiles**

Live tiles are similar to thumbnails of the programs.

3. **Charms bar**

The Charms bar is a context-sensitive area containing settings and other useful functions.

How do I open the Charms bar?

Swipe the right-hand edge of the screen inwards to open the Charms bar.

How do I get to *Start*?

Press the Windows key, or swipe the right-hand edge of the screen to open the Charms bar and tap **Start**.

How do I jump between programs/apps?

Swipe the left-hand edge of the screen inwards to cycle through programs/apps that are currently running.

Alternatively you can drag the left-hand edge of the screen in slightly and release the thumbnail to open thumbnails of current programs/apps.

How do I turn off my computer?

Open the Charms bar, tap **Settings > Power** and select the action you'd like to take. Alternatively, from *Desktop*, tap **Acer Power Button** and select the action you'd like to take.

What is this thing called "Metro?"

"Metro" is a new interface for Windows 8 that is designed to work well with touch input. Programs written for Metro will automatically use the whole screen and don't require closing in the traditional way. Metro apps will be displayed on *Start* using live-tiles.

What are "live tiles?"

Live tiles are similar to thumbnails of the programs that will be updated with new content whenever you're connected to the Internet. So, for example, you can view weather or stock updates without needing to open the app.
