In order to prevent potential danger, please observe the following instructions when installing, operating and cleaning the product. To ensure your safety and prolong the service life of your LCD product, please read the following precautions carefully before using the product.

1. Read instructions — All operating instructions must be read and understood before the product is operated.
2. Keep this manual in a safe place — These safety and operating instructions must be kept in a safe place for future reference.
3. Observe warnings — All warnings on the product and in the instructions must be observed closely.
4. Follow instructions — All operating instructions must be followed.
5. Cleaning — Unplug the power cord from the AC outlet before cleaning the product. Use a dry cloth to clean the product. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners.
6. Attachments — Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer. Use of inadequate attachments can result in accidents.
7. Water and moisture — Do not use the product near water. Do not install the product in a place where water may splash onto it. Be careful of equipment which drains water such as an air-conditioner.
8. Ventilation — The vents and other openings in the cabinet are designed for ventilation. Do not cover or block these vents and openings since insufficient ventilation can cause overheating and/or shorten the life of the product. - Do not display a still picture for a long period, as this could cause a residual image.
- Never rub or tap the monitor with hard objects.
- Please understand that ASUSTeK COMPUTER Inc. bears no responsibility for errors made during use by the customer or a third party, nor for any other malfunctions or damage to this product arising during use, except where indemnity liability is recognized under law.
- This monitor and its accessories may be upgraded without advance notice.
- Do not use the monitor where there is a lot of dust, where humidity is high, or where the monitor may come into contact with oil or steam. Do not use in an environment where there are corrosive gases (sulfur dioxide, hydrogen sulfide, nitrogen dioxide, chlorine, ammonia, ozone, etc.). As this could lead to fire.
- Ensure that the monitor does not come into contact with water or other fluids. Ensure that no objects such as paper clips or pins enter the monitor as this could lead to fire or electric shock.
- Do not place the monitor on top of unstable objects or in unsafe places. Do not allow the monitor to receive strong shocks or to strongly vibrate. Causing the monitor to fall or topple over may damage it.

- Depending on the application you are using, the supplied touch pen and digitizer pen may not function.
- If another USB device is connected to the computer to which the touch panel is connected, do not operate the USB device during touch panel input. Input may not take place correctly.
- Do not use liquid such as alcohol in cleaning the screen.
- Keep all cables off the touch panel. Not doing so may lead to LCD monitor malfunctions.
- If used in a room (or location) with drastic temperature differences, the display quality of the screen and the quality of touch panel performance may decrease.
- Do not drop the AC adapter or subject it to impact.
- Never disassemble the AC adapter. It contains high voltage parts that are dangerous to touch.
- The AC adapter is for indoor use only. Do not use it outside.
- Do not use the supplied AC adapter with other devices.

System Requirements

■Touch panel

To use the touch panel, the monitor must be connected to a computer using a USB cable.

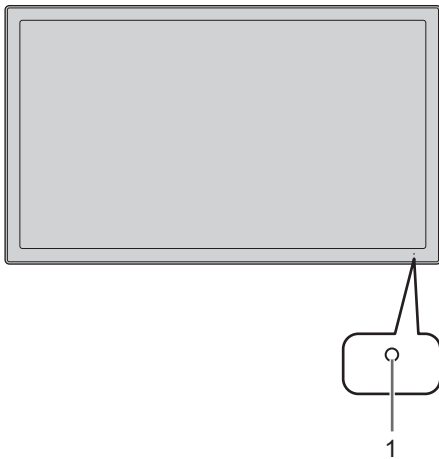
Touch panel operating conditions are as described below.

- The digitizer pen can be used with Windows 7 or later.

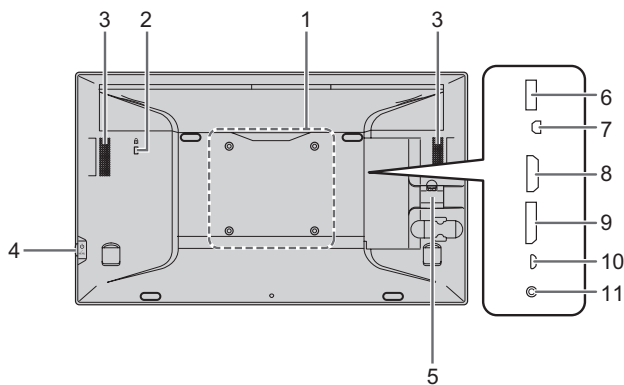

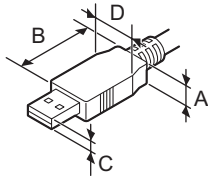

Connecting Devices

! Caution

- Be sure to turn off the power and disconnect the plug from the power outlet before connecting/disconnecting cables. Also, read the manual of the equipment to be connected.
- Do not forcibly bend or apply force to cables. Doing so may result in wire breakage or other damage.
- When connecting cables, spread a soft cloth on a stable level surface such as a desk, and gently place the monitor on it with the screen facing down.
- Do not use any cable that has a damaged or deformed terminal. Using such cables may cause malfunctions.
- Connect USB devices that have the following thicknesses around the connector area.



- A ≤ 1/2 inch (12mm)
- B ≤ 1-1/2 inch (38mm)
- C ≤ 5/16 inch (8mm)
- D ≤ 11/16 inch (17mm)

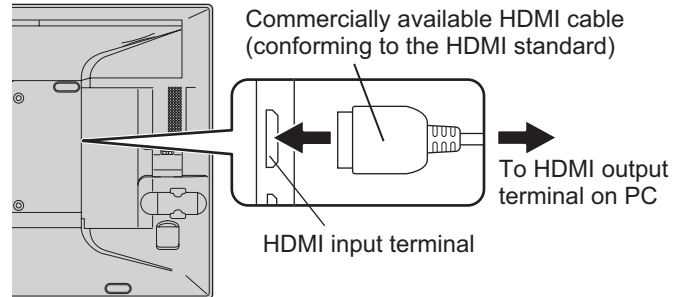
- Images may not be displayed properly depending on the computer (video card) to be connected.
- To use the digitizer pen, the necessary software must be installed on the computer from the supplied CD-ROM.
- When connecting a USB device to the USB terminal, use only USB devices with current consumption of 500mA or lower.

Connection with a PC

Connect the monitor and a PC using the connection cable.

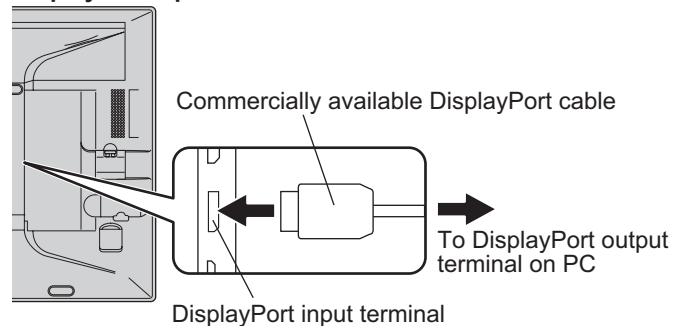

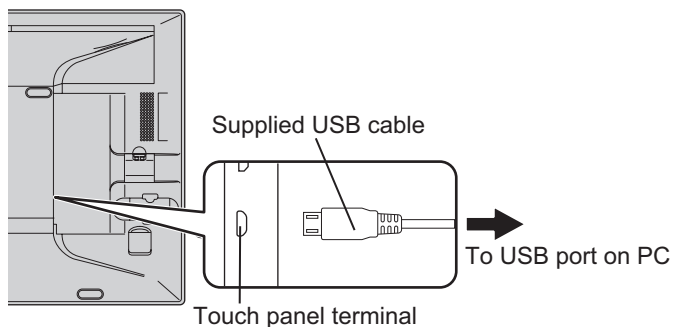

- If the LCD monitor is turned on when there are input signals from both terminals, the video from the DisplayPort input terminal is displayed (factory default).

■Using the touch panel

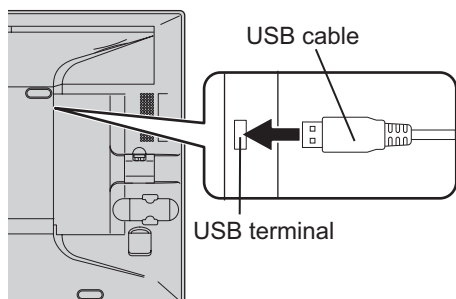
To use the touch panel, connect the monitor to a USB port on a PC using the supplied USB cable.



Check the orientation of the connector and insert it horizontally as far as it will go.

Connecting USB devices

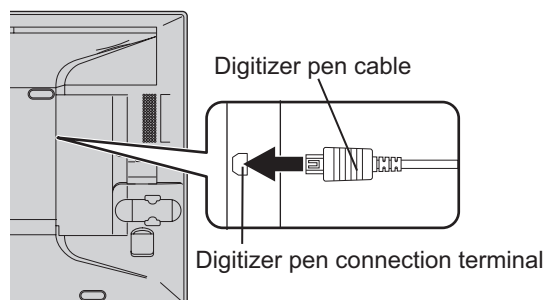
When using a commercially available mouse, keyboard, or other device, connect the device to the USB port.

Binding Cables

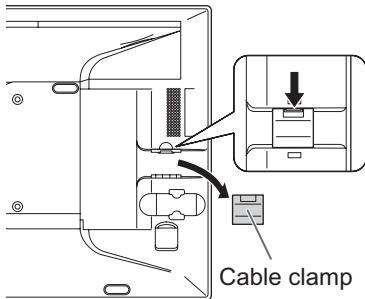

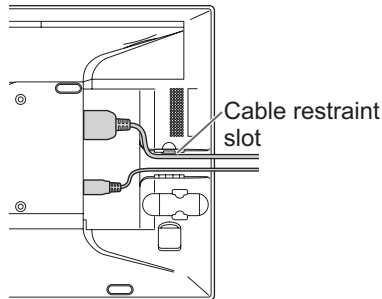
Video cable and USB cable

Secure the video cable (HDMI or DisplayPort) and USB cable using the cable clamp.

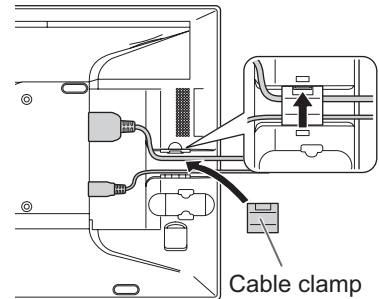
1. Remove the cable clamp.



2. Route the cables through the cable restraint slot.



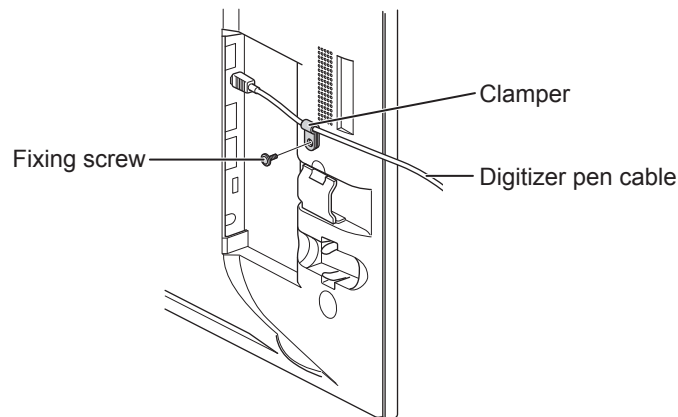
3. Push the cable clamp down into place.

You can secure the digitizer pen cable using the supplied clammer and fixing screw.

- Attach the clamper using the fixing screw.

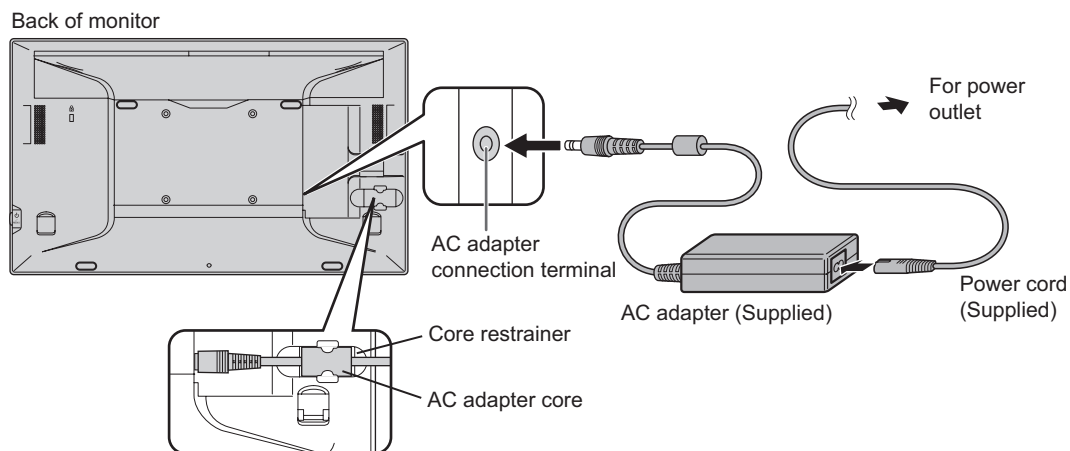

Installation

Installing on a stand (Standing position)

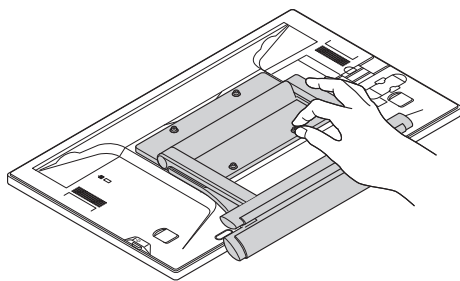
Placement on the variable stand

Place the unit on the supplied variable stand.

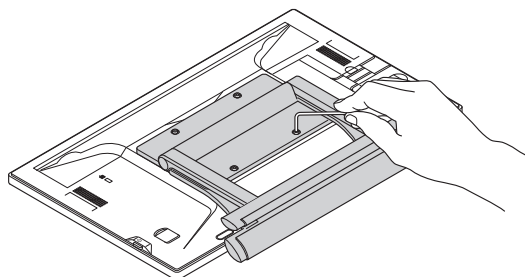
! Caution

- The variable stand is designed for placement of the unit in the landscape orientation. It cannot be used for the portrait orientation.
- When connecting the stand, spread a soft cloth on a stable level surface such as a desk, and gently place the monitor on it with the screen facing down.
- Applying excessive pressure to the LCD panel with your hands may result in damage to the unit.
- Be careful not to get your fingers caught when adjusting the angle. There is a risk of injury.

1. Place the variable stand on the rear of the monitor, insert the fixing screws and tighten by hand to position the stand.

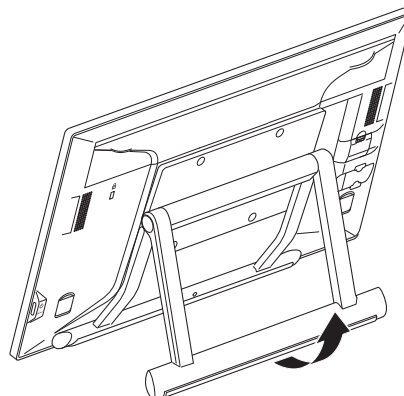


2. Securely tighten the fixing screws using the supplied hexagonal wrench.

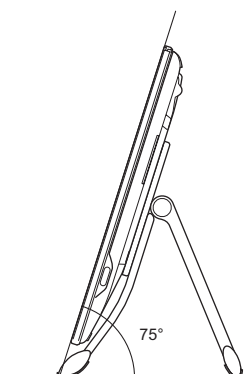
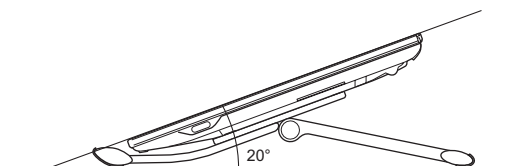


3. Place the monitor in the standing position, and adjust the angle of the stand.

Hold the top of the display with one hand so that it does not fall over, hold the rear leg of the stand with your other hand, and adjust the angle of the stand.



The legs can extend about 20 to 75 degrees in relation to the flat surface.



Installing on a table (Pen writing position/Horizontal position)

Remove the monitor from the stand and place face-down on a table or other level surface.

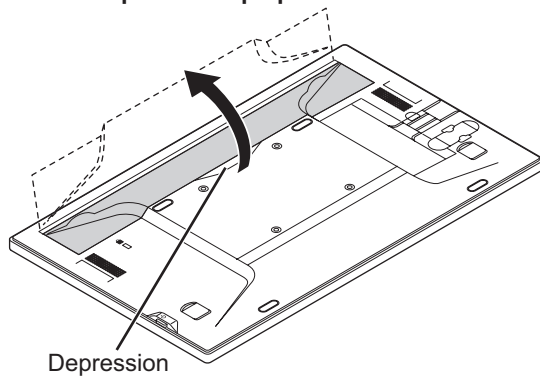
! Caution

- Do not exert a large amount of force on the monitor from above. Doing so may damage the flap.
- After removing the monitor from the rack stand, store the stand so that the screws will not be lost.

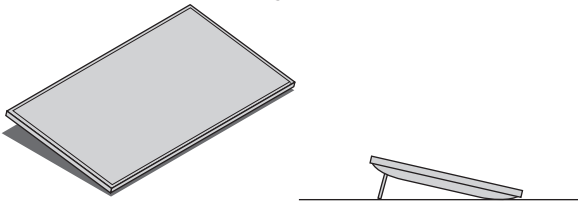
Pen writing position

Place the monitor on a table or other level surface.

1. Hold the flap by the depression on the back of the monitor and pull the flap up.



2. Place the monitor where you want to use it.



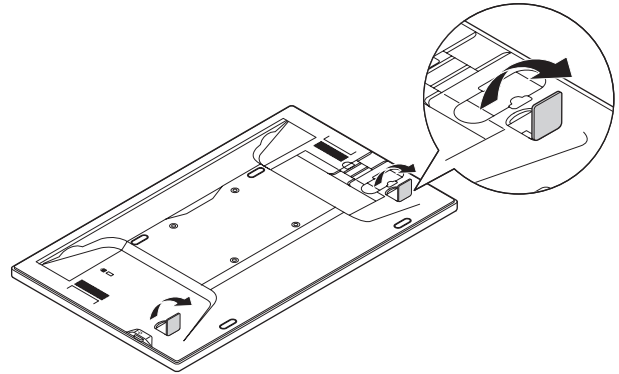
Horizontal position

Place the monitor on a table or other level surface.

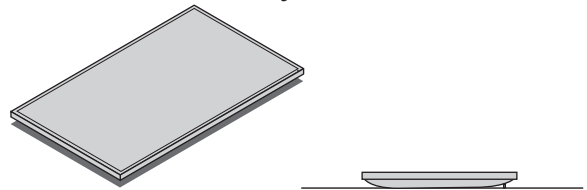

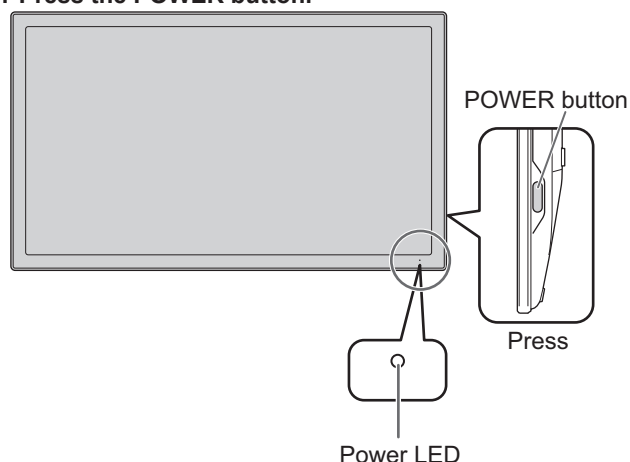

Turning Power On/Off

Turning on the power

1. Press the **POWER** button.



The power LED turns on.

2. **Turn on the PC.**

The screen appears.

! Caution

- When switching the **POWER** button off and back on, always wait for an interval of at least 5 seconds. Rapid switching may lead to errors or malfunctions.
- High temperatures inside the unit are indicated when the Power LED is alternately flashing red and green, and may lead to the power turning off automatically. (See page 26.)
- For a complete electrical disconnection, pull out the main plug.

■ Operation Mode

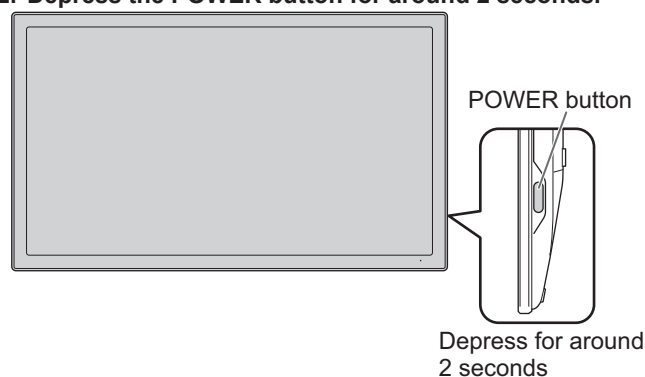
When the monitor is turned on for the first time after being shipped from the factory, the operation mode setting screen will be displayed. Set it to **ECO Mode** or **Normal Mode**.

ECO Mode - If there is no operation for 4 hours or more, the monitor automatically turns off the power.

Normal Mode - Will perform standard operation. Even after being set, changes can be made using [Operation Mode], located in the menu of the monitor.

Turning off the power

1. Turn off the **PC**.
2. Depress the **POWER** button for around 2 seconds.



The power LED turns off.

! Caution

- If the monitor will not be used for a long time, disconnect the power plug from the power outlet.

Touch Actions

Touch action modes

There are three touch action modes: finger/pen mode, pen-only mode, and finger-only mode. These modes can be changed on the menu screen.

The monitor is set to finger/pen mode when shipped.

! Caution

- Use the supplied pen in pen mode.

Finger/pen mode

You can perform touch actions with your fingers or pens (digitizer pen).

Touch actions performed with a pen are given priority, and any actions performed at the same time with your fingers will be disabled. Pen actions have priority, even during hover operations. (See page 19.)

Finger actions will be enabled again about 0.5 seconds after you remove the pen from the screen.

Pen-only mode

This mode is for pen (digitizer pen) use only. You cannot touch the screen with your finger. You can touch the menu screen (See page 21) with your finger.

Finger-only mode

This mode is for finger use only. You cannot touch the screen with the digitizer pen.

Touch action

Touch actions that can be used with this monitor differs from operating system and application. The functions of touch actions are also different. For details, check Windows Help and the application's support documentation.

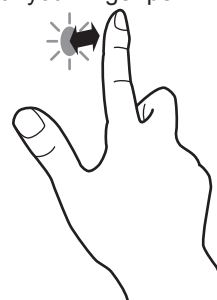

- In Windows 7, if the checkmark has been removed from "Enable multi-touch gestures and inking" in "Pen and touch" in Control Panel, select the checkbox.

Single-tap

Touch the screen with your finger/pen.



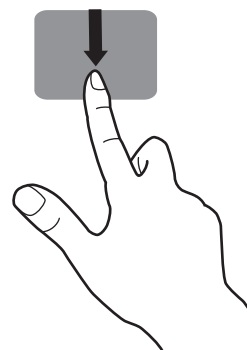
Double-tap

Quickly touch the screen twice with your finger/pen.



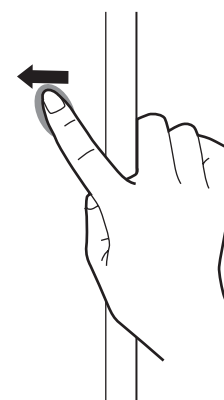
Swipe

Touch the screen with your finger/pen, move without lifting, and then stop.



Swipe from edge of screen

After touching the edge of the screen with your finger/pen, move horizontally without releasing your finger/pen and then stop.

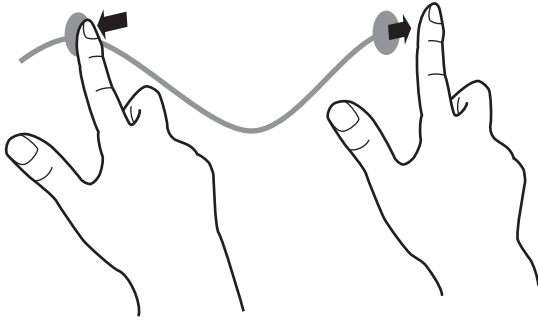

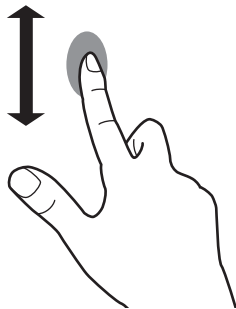

Touch the screen with your finger/pen and move without lifting. When you have finished the movement, lift your finger/pen.



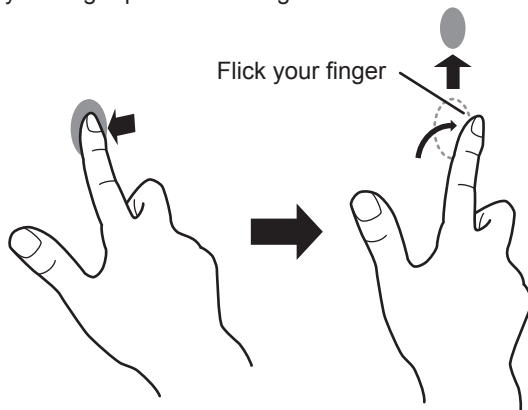
Slide to pan

With your finger/pen touching the screen, move it up and down to scroll the screen.



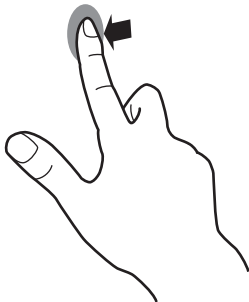

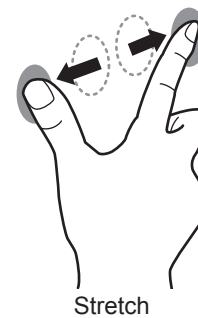
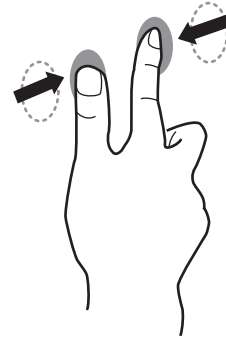
Press briefly with your finger/pen, and then lift your finger/pen from the screen.

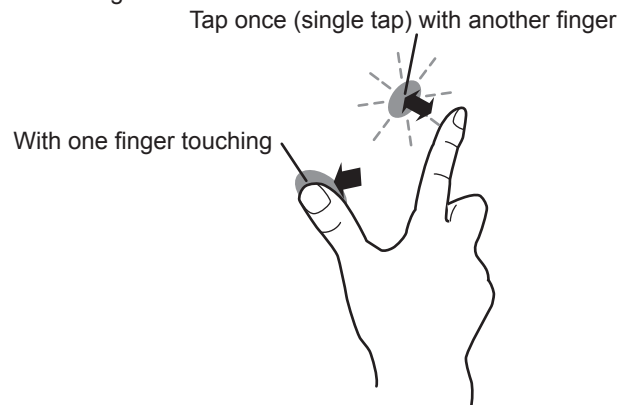
Zoom

While touching the screen with two fingers, move them closer together and farther apart.



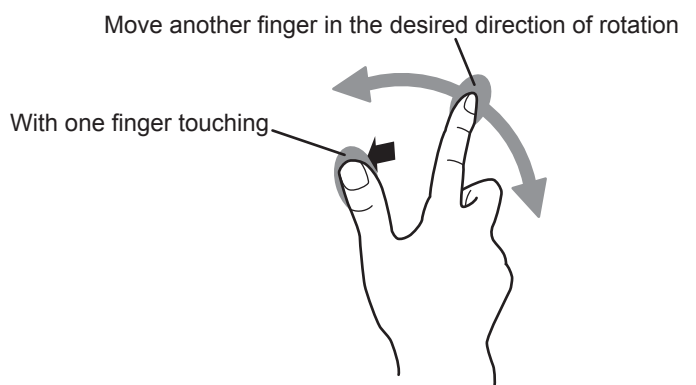
Press-and-tap

While touching the monitor with one finger, move the other finger in the direction you wish to rotate in.

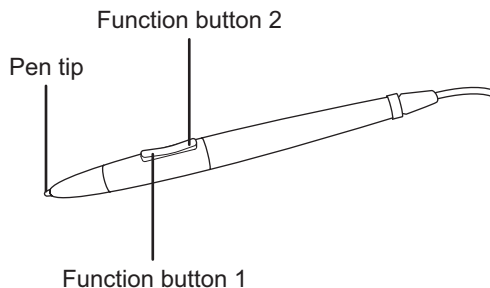


Digitizer pen

The PT201 monitor supports a digitizer pen. To use the digitizer pen, the utility software must be installed and configured. (See page 19.)

■Digitizer pen actions

Button operations



Function button 1: Pressing and holding this button and touching the screen performs the same action as a right-click on a mouse. (factory default)

Function button 2: Pressing and holding this button while moving the pen on the screen enables the eraser function. (factory default)

You can change the functions that are assigned to the function buttons using the digitizer pen utility.

Hover operations

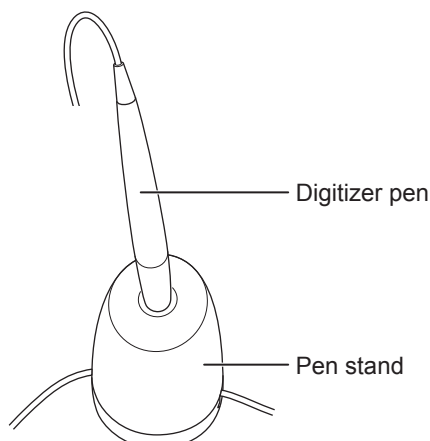
The unit will recognize when the tip of the pen is hovering within 15 mm of the screen, allowing you to position the pointer without touching the screen.

TIPS

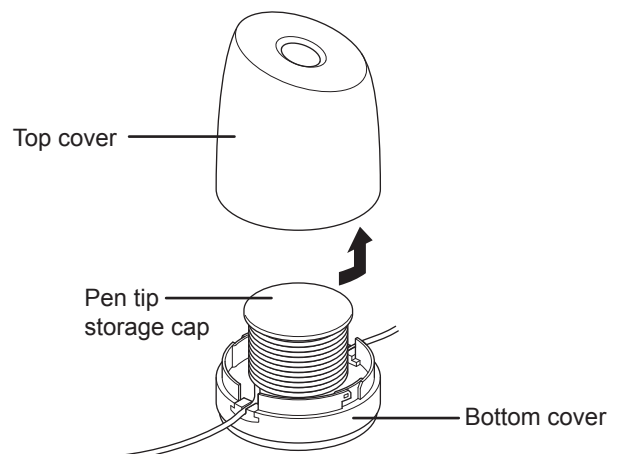
- The digitizer pen supports pen pressure functions. The pen can be used with software that responds to pen pressure.
- The digitizer pen may not be recognized, depending on the application, if you touch the display with the pen before the hover operation is enabled. Verify that the hover operation is enabled and then perform operations using the digitizer pen.
- If the digitizer pen does not operate correctly, try placing the tip of the pen vertically on the screen.

■Digitizer pen stand

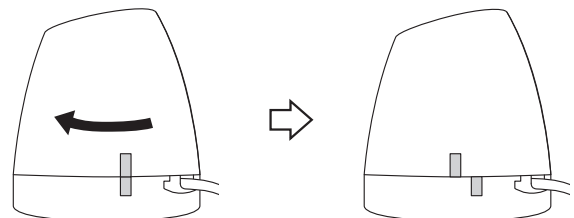
Place the digitizer pen in the pen stand when it is not being used.



You can wrap the digitizer pen cable around the digitizer pen stand.



Close the top cover and bottom cover as shown in the following diagram.



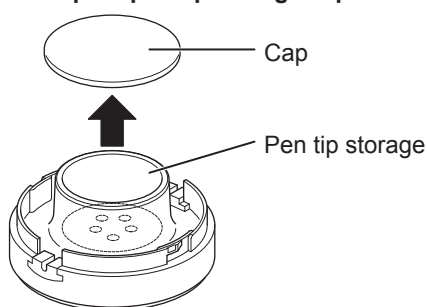
■ Spare pen tip storage

The pen stand features a pen tip storage area where you can store spare pen tips.

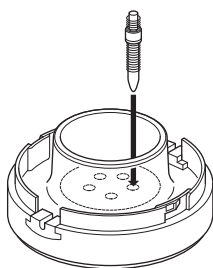
TIPS

- Spare pen tips are not stored in the stand at the time of purchase. Store the spare pen tips in the pen stand to make sure you do not lose them.

1. Remove the spare pen tip storage cap.



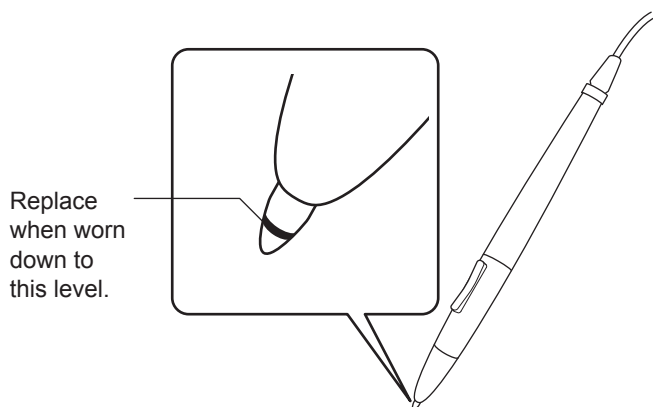
2. Insert the spare pen tips into the holes in the pen tip storage.



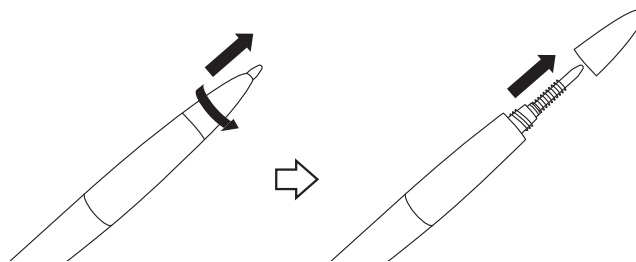
3. Reattach the cap.

■ Replacing the digitizer pen tip

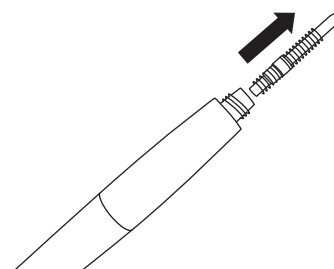
Replace the pen tip when it is worn or damaged. Using the digitizer pen with a worn or damaged pen tip may scratch the surface of the monitor, or may cause the digitizer pen function to stop operating. Pen tips will wear with normal use.



1. Unscrew the pen tip cover and remove it.



2. Pull out the pen tip.



3. Insert a new pen tip, and reattach the pen tip cover.

Other functions

In Windows 8.1/8, input panel functions can be used.

In Windows 7, touch pointer and input panel functions can be used.

For information about the touch pointer and input panel functions, see Windows Help.

Touch pointer :

A translucent image of a mouse appears near the point touched. The left/right buttons of the image can be clicked to perform the same actions as left/right clicking a mouse.

Input panel :

A software keyboard and an input panel with handwriting recognition appear on the screen.

Windows 8.1/8 and Windows 7 (excluding Starter), the ink function of Microsoft Office can be used.

Handwritten comments can be written, and handwriting can be recognized using this function.

For details, see Microsoft Office Help.

Cautionary points

- When performing touch actions, use the ball of your finger.
- Use only the supplied digitizer pen or touch pen to perform pen actions.
- Do not use the supplied pen for any purpose other than touch panel operation.
- Do not press hard on the tip of the digitizer pen.
- If there is dirt or foreign matter on the tip of the digitizer pen, remove it. Failure to do so may damage the screen.
- Even when in pen-only mode, the unit may respond to objects other than the supplied digitizer pen.
- When performing pen actions with the supplied digitizer pen, do not touch the screen with anything other than the hand that is holding the pen.

Menu operations

The monitor settings are configured by displaying the menu screen.

The operations on this page are the basic operations.

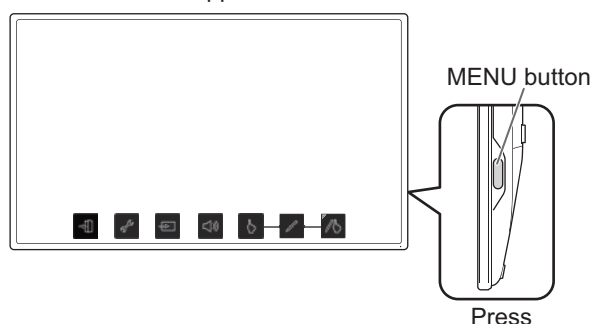

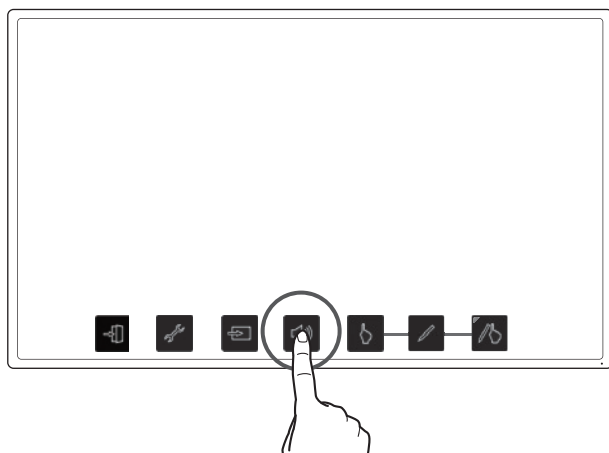

Finger/pen mode

This icon switches the touch action mode to finger/pen mode.

When using the touch pen (digitizer pen is not connected), (▤) appears. When the digitizer pen is connected, (▤) appears.

The touch mark (see page 25) becomes the finger/pen mark (▤) or (▤).



Pen-only mode

This icon switches the touch action mode to pen-only mode.

When using the touch pen (digitizer pen is not connected), (▤) appears. When the digitizer pen is connected, (▤) appears.

The touch mark becomes the finger/pen mark (▤) or (▤).



Finger-only mode

This icon switches the touch action mode to finger-only mode.

The touch mark becomes the finger-only mark (▤).



Volume

This icon adjusts speaker and headphone volume.

Touching [Mute] temporarily sets the volume to 0.

Touching [Mute] again returns the volume to the previous level.



Input Select

This icon manually switches the signal input source from the PC.

Touching the icon displays HDMI and DisplayPort.

A (▤) mark is added to the input source being displayed.



Setup

This icon configures the monitor.

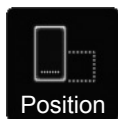

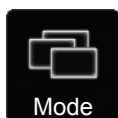

Position

When the monitor is used in portrait orientation (power/menu button on the top), this icon moves the display position of the menu screen to the bottom of the screen.



Mode

Normal

This mode is suited to normal PC screen display.

This mode is suited to pen writing position.

Game

This mode is suited to video games.

Multimedia

This mode is suited to video playback.

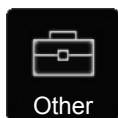

Brightness

This icon adjusts the brightness of the backlight.



Other

Operation Mode

Eco Mode: If there is no operation for 4 hours or more, the monitor automatically turns off the power.

Normal Mode: Will perform standard operation.

Video Input Setting

RGB Range

This setting configures the range of the RGB input signal. Use "Auto" for normal operation. If the range cannot be set correctly in "Auto", adjust to match the video. Varying the setting may cause floating blacks or reduced gradations to appear.

DisplayPort Mode

This setting configures the DisplayPort mode. Use "DisplayPort Mode1" for normal operation. If the following symptoms occur in "DisplayPort Mode1", set the mode to "DisplayPort Mode2".

- The video is interrupted, flickers, or is not displayed.

Mode on Start Up

Touch Mode

This setting configures the touch action mode (See page 22) used when the monitor is turned on.

Reset: The monitor starts in finger/pen mode.

Save: The monitor starts in the mode that was last used.

Position

This setting is used to set the position of the menu at startup.

Reset: Sets the display position of the menu at startup to "Bottom in Portrait Orientation".

Save: Sets the position to that when power was last turned off.

Pen Position Adjustment

This setting adjusts the pointer position if the pen tip position is different than the pointer indicator position.

Mark

Touch Mark: This setting configures how to display the touch mark (See page 25).

Key Mark: This setting configures how to display the key mark (See page 25).

Selects the notification method for an abnormal temperature.

This setting configures whether or not to display the logo screen during startup.

This setting changes the menu screen display language.

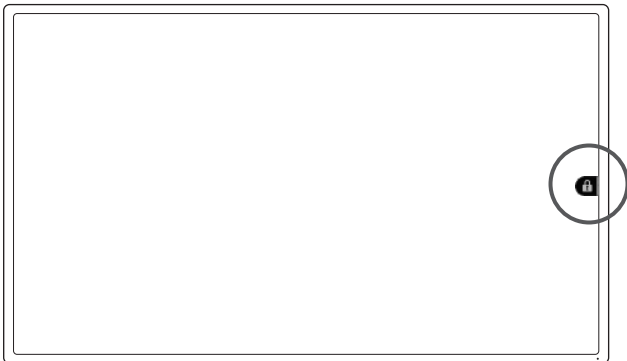


Reset

Prohibiting operations (operation lock)

Troubleshooting

If you are experiencing any problem with your display, before calling for service, please review the following troubleshooting tips.

There is no picture or sound.

- Are the AC adapter and power cord connected correctly? (See page 13.)
- Is the power on? (See page 16.)
- The power may turn off automatically if an abnormal temperature condition occurs (see page 16). If this occurs, move the unit to a cool location before turning the power on again.

There is a picture but no sound.

- Make sure the volume is not set to minimum. (See page 22.)
- Is the sound muted? (See page 22.)
- No sound will come from the speakers when the monitor is in standby mode (when the power LED is orange). (See page 16.)

The video does not appear.

- Is the cable certified for HDMI or DisplayPort? The monitor will not work unless a standards-compliant cable is used.
- Is the input signal compatible with this monitor? (See page 29.)
- Is the monitor connected correctly to the PC?
- Is the PC turned on?
- Is video being output from the PC?
- Is the PC in power-saving mode? Try pressing a key on the keyboard or moving the mouse.
- Turn off the LCD monitor power, wait 5 seconds or longer, and then turn the power on again.

The video does not appear properly.

- If a powerful amount of strain is exerted on the touch display, a portion of the display may remain on the screen. In this situation, turn off the monitor power, wait 5 seconds or longer, and then turn the power on again.

The touch panel does not respond.

- Is the USB cable connected properly? (See page 11.)
- The touch panel may not work properly if there is a large contact area (e.g. if the screen is touched with the palm of the hand).
- Is the monitor in pen-only mode? Touch action is disabled in pen-only mode. (See page 17, 22.)
- Is the monitor in finger-only mode? Digitizer pen and touch pen actions are disabled in finger-only mode. (See page 17, 22.)
- Are monitor operations locked? (See page 25.)
- When there is no signal input to the LCD monitor, actions on the touch panel are not possible. Please operate the PC using the mouse and keyboard.
- Is the digitizer pen cable connected properly? (See page 11.)
- Is the tip of the digitizer pen worn? If it is worn, replace the pen tip. (See page 20.)
- Use the supplied USB cable only. The unit may not operate correctly if using a commercially available USB cable. If you want to use a longer USB cable than the one supplied, extend the cable using a USB cable with a repeater.

The response of the touch screen is slow.

Some parts of the screen do not respond.

- When starting your computer or connecting the USB cable, do not touch the touch panel.
- When starting the LCD monitor, do not touch the screen. If the screen is touched, the monitor may not function correctly. In this situation, turn off the LCD monitor power, wait 5 seconds or longer, and then turn the power on again.
- While the menu screen is displayed, touch actions are not possible other than those for the menu screen. First exit the menu screen and then perform the operation.
