

Highlights of the VIXIA HF G20

The Canon VIXIA HF G20 HD Camcorder is a high-performance camcorder whose compact size makes it ideal in a variety of situations. The following are just some of the many functions featured in the camcorder.

HD Recording

HD CMOS PRO and DIGIC DV III processor

The camcorder is equipped with a 1/3-inch CMOS sensor that captures video at an effective pixel count of approximately 2.07 megapixels (1920x1080). The video is then processed by the state-of-the-art DIGIC DV III image processor. This allows the camcorder to excel in low-light situations and produce a wide dynamic range.

Wide zoom lens

With a focal length at full wide angle of 30.4 mm (35 mm equivalent), the camcorder has superb wide-angle shooting capability. The minimum object distance is 60 cm (2 ft.) throughout the entire zoom range, which means that you can create a pleasing blurred background effect at full telephoto. The 8-bladed iris aperture also enhances the blurred background effect.

Shoot cinematic video

Using CINEMA mode and the cinema-look filters (

101), you can make recordings that truly look and feel cinematic.

Operability

Emphasis on versatility

This camcorder has features to make it usable as a main camera but is also small enough to be very portable. The advanced image stabilization (\$\subseteq\$ 55) will let you shoot in a variety of situations in the field. Moreover, in full-automatic mode, Intelligent IS (\$\subseteq\$ 40) will select the optimal type of image stabilization for the recording situation.

Manual controls at your fingertips

The focus ring helps you achieve the focus you are looking for. Furthermore, you can assign certain frequently used functions to a customizable button and adjust those functions with the accompanying dial (\$\square\$ 84).

Face detection

When a subject's face is detected, the camcorder can track and focus on it (49). Furthermore, you can have the camcorder in manual focus but switch to autofocus only when a face is detected, ensuring that important subjects are in focus.

Relay recording and double slot recording

When you use relay recording (

35), you can use the double memory card slot to keep on recording video without interruption. Double slot recording (

36) allows you to record movies simultaneously to two memory cards, which is a convenient way to back up your recordings.

Other Features

Audio

With the audio scene select function (\$\sum_68\$), you can optimize the audio settings of the built-in microphone by selecting the audio scene that matches your surroundings. Your audience will feel even more immersed in the scene during playback.

Smart AUTO

Smart AUTO (40) automatically selects the best scene mode for the scene you want to shoot. You get spectacular recordings every time without worrying about settings.

LCD screen and viewfinder

The LCD screen and viewfinder both have 100% frame coverage, which will ensure that you can accurately check that your shots are framed how you want them.


Touch AE

By simply touching the screen, you can make dark areas in the picture appear brighter (\$\sum_{\text{O}}\$ 60). This operation is simple yet allows you to shoot with the desired exposure.

Charging the Battery Pack

The camcorder can be powered with a battery pack or directly using the compact power adapter. For approximate charging times and recording/playback times with a fully charged battery pack, refer to *Charging, Recording and Playback Times* (171).

- 1 Connect the power cord to the compact power adapter.
- 2 Plug the power cord into a power outlet.
- 3 Connect the compact power adapter to the camcorder's DC IN terminal.



- 4 Attach the battery pack to the camcorder.
 - Press the battery pack softly into the battery attachment unit and slide it forward until it clicks in place.




5 Charging will start when the camcorder is turned off.

- If the camcorder was on, the green ON/OFF (CHG) indicator will go out when you turn off the camcorder. After a moment, the ON/OFF (CHG) indicator will turn on in red (battery pack charging). The red ON/OFF (CHG) indicator will go out when the battery pack is fully charged.
- If the indicator flashes, refer to *Troubleshooting* (156).



To remove the battery pack

- 1 Slide BATTERY RELEASE in the direction of the arrow and hold it pressed down.
- 2 Slide the battery pack and then pull it out.





- Turn off the camcorder before connecting or disconnecting the compact power adapter. After
 pressing POWER to turn off the camcorder, important data is updated in the memory. Be sure to
 wait until the green ON/OFF (CHG) indicator goes out.
- Do not connect to the camcorder's DC IN terminal or to the compact power adapter any electrical equipment that is not expressly recommended for use with this camcorder.
- To prevent equipment breakdowns and excessive heating, do not connect the supplied compact power adapter to voltage converters for overseas travels or special power sources such as those on aircraft and ships, DC-AC inverters, etc.

(i) NOTES

- We recommend charging the battery pack in temperatures between 10 °C and 30 °C (50 °F and 86 °F). If either the ambient temperature or the battery pack's temperature is outside the range of approx. 0 °C to 40 °C (32 °F to 104 °F), charging will not start.
- The battery pack will be charged only when the camcorder is off.
- If the power supply was disconnected while charging a battery pack, make sure the ON/OFF (CHG)
 indicator has gone out before restoring the power supply.
- If remaining battery time is an issue, you can power the camcorder using the compact power adapter so the battery pack will not be consumed.
- Charged battery packs continue to discharge naturally. Therefore, charge them on the day of use, or the day before, to ensure a full charge.
- The first time you use a battery pack, fully charge it and then use the camcorder until the battery
 pack is completely exhausted. Doing so will ensure that the remaining recording time will be
 displayed accurately.
- We recommend that you prepare battery packs to last 2 to 3 times longer than you think you might need.
- USA and Canada only: The Lithium ion/polymer battery that powers the product is recyclable. Please call 1-800-8-BATTERY for information on how to recycle this battery.



Preparing the Camcorder


This section covers the basic preparations for the camcorder such as attaching the lens hood, adjusting the grip belt and adjusting the viewfinder and LCD screen. When attaching the lens hood, grip belt and straps, be careful not to drop the camcorder.

Attaching the Lens Hood

Attach the lens hood to protect the lens and reduce the amount of stray light that may hit the lens. Remove the lens cap before attaching the lens hood.

Place the lens hood on the front of the lens so that the groove on the lens hood is aligned with the bottom of the lens (1), and then turn the lens hood clockwise until it stops with a click (2).


- Be careful not to deform the lens hood.
- Make sure that the lens hood is aligned with the thread.
- To remove the lens hood, turn it counterclockwise.



Using the Viewfinder

If it is difficult to use the LCD screen while the LCD backlight is on (\$\sum 24\$), you can use the viewfinder. You can also use the viewfinder when you rotate the LCD panel 180 degrees to let the subject watch the recording.

- 1 Pull out the viewfinder.
- 2 Press POWER to turn on the camcorder.
- 3 Adjust the viewfinder using the dioptric adjustment lever.
 - You can close the LCD panel or rotate it toward the subject as you prefer.
 - The LCD backlight setting (24) is common to the LCD screen and the viewfinder.



 If you wear glasses, you may find the viewfinder easier to use if you flip back the outer edge of the eye cup toward the camcorder body.






- Make sure you keep the eye cup attached when using the camcorder.
- For details about how to take care of the viewfinder, refer to *Handling Precautions* (165), *Cleaning* (168).

Adjusting the Position and Brightness of the LCD Screen

Rotating the LCD Panel

Open the LCD panel 90 degrees.

- You can rotate the panel 90 degrees downward.
- You can rotate the panel 180 degrees toward the lens. Rotating the LCD panel 180 degrees can be useful in the following cases:
 - To allow the subject to monitor the LCD screen while you use the viewfinder.
 - To include yourself in the picture when recording with the self timer.
 - To allow the camcorder to be operated with the wireless controller from the front.





Subject can monitor the LCD screen (you can use the viewfinder at the same time)




About the LCD and viewfinder screens: The screens are produced using extremely high-precision
manufacturing techniques, with more than 99.99% of the pixels operating to specification. Less
than 0.01% of the pixels may occasionally misfire or appear as black, red, blue or green dots. This
has no effect on the recorded image and does not constitute a malfunction.

LCD Backlight

When recording in bright places it may be difficult to use the LCD screen. Turn on the LCD backlight to make it brighter.

With the camcorder on, hold $\boxed{\mbox{DISP}}$ pressed down for more than 2 seconds.

 Repeat this action to switch the LCD backlight between off (normal) and on (bright).



(i) NOTES

- Adjusting the brightness does not affect the brightness of the recordings.
- Using the bright setting will shorten the effective usage time of the battery pack.
- You can further adjust the brightness of the LCD screen with the \(\bigcap \) \(\bigcap \) [LCD Brightness] setting, or dim it with the \(\bigcap \) \(\bigcap \) [LCD Screen Dimmer] setting to use in places where the light from the LCD screen can be a nuisance.
- For details about how to take care of the touch screen, refer to *Handling Precautions* (165), Cleaning (168).

Grip Belt and Straps

Fasten the grip belt.


- Adjust the grip belt so that you can reach the zoom lever with your index finger, and the <u>START/STOP</u> button with your thumb.
- You can attach the supplied stylus pen to the grip belt.



Attaching an optional wrist strap


Attach the wrist strap to the strap mount on the grip belt, adjust the length and fasten.

• You can use both for extra convenience and protection.



Attaching an optional shoulder strap

Pass the ends of the shoulder strap through the strap mount on the grip belt and adjust the length of the strap.



Wireless Controller

First, insert the supplied CR2025 lithium button battery into the wireless controller.


- 1 Press the tab in the direction of the arrow and pull out the battery holder.
- 2 Place the lithium button battery with the + side facing up.
- 3 Insert the battery holder.



To use the wireless controller

Point the wireless controller at the camcorder's remote sensor when you press the buttons.


 You can rotate the LCD panel 180 degrees to use the wireless controller from the front of the camcorder.



(i) NOTES

- When the camcorder cannot be operated with the wireless controller, or when it can only be operated at very close range, replace the battery.
- The wireless controller may not work properly when the remote sensor is situated under strong light sources or direct sunlight.

You can mount the camcorder on a tripod but do not use tripods with mounting screws longer than 6.5 mm (0.26 in.) as this may cause damage to the camcorder.



Basic Operation of the Camcorder

Using the Touch Screen

The control buttons and menu items that appear on the touch screen change dynamically depending on the operating mode and the task you are performing. With the intuitive touch screen interface you have all the controls at your fingertips. You can also use the supplied stylus pen for a more precise operation.


Touch

Press firmly on an element displayed on the touch screen. Used to start playing back a scene in an index screen, to select a setting from the menus, to select the subject whom the camcorder will recognize as the main subject of the scene, etc.

Drag

While applying pressure, swipe your finger up and down or left and right across the screen.

Used to scroll menus, to browse through index screen pages or to adjust slider controls like the volume.





IMPORTANT

- The camcorder uses a pressure-sensitive touch screen. Press firmly when using touch operations.
- In the following cases, you may not be able to perform touch operations correctly.
 - Using your fingernails or hard-tipped objects other than the supplied stylus pen, such as ballpoint pens.
 - Operating the touch screen with wet or gloved hands.
 - Applying excessive force or forcefully scratching the touch screen.
 - Attaching commercially available screen protectors or adhesive film onto the touch screen's surface.



- When switching to a playback mode, the memory selected for playback will be the same currently used for recording.
- You can also press and hold (with on the wireless controller for more than 2 seconds to switch between recording and playback mode.





First Time Settings

Setting the Date and Time

You will need to set the date and time of the camcorder before you can start using it. The [Date/Time] screen will appear automatically when the camcorder's clock is not set.

- 1 Press POWER to turn on the camcorder.
 - The [Date/Time] screen appears and the year will be selected.
- 2 Touch a field you want to change (year, month, day, hours or minutes).
- 3 Touch [▲] or [▼] to change the field as necessary.
- 4 Set the correct date and time by changing all the fields in the same way.
- 5 Touch [Y.M.D], [M.D,Y] or [D.M.Y] to select the date format you prefer.
 - In some screens, the date will be displayed in short form (numbers instead of month names or only the day and month), but it will still follow the order you selected.

- 7 Touch [OK] to start the clock and close the setup screen.

(i) NOTES

- You can adjust the date and time later on with the Date/Time] setting.
- When you do not use the camcorder for about 3 months, the built-in rechargeable lithium battery
 may discharge completely and the date and time setting may be lost. In such case, recharge the
 built-in lithium battery (167) and set the time zone, date and time again.

Changing the Language

The default language of the camcorder is English. You can set it to one of 27 languages.





- 1 Open the [Language 🕮] screen.
 - [FUNC.] ▶ [MENU] ▶ ► ▶ [Language]
 - Touching [FUNC.] is necessary only when performing the procedure in a recording mode.
- 2 Touch the desired language and then touch [X].



 Some control buttons, such as [ZOOM], [FUNC.] and [MENU], will appear in English regardless of the language selected. Change the time zone to match your location. The default setting is New York. In addition, the camcorder is able to retain the date and time of an additional location. This is convenient when you travel so that you can set the camcorder to match the time of your home location or that of your travel destination.

- 1 Open the [Time Zone/DST] screen.
 - [FUNC.] > [MENU] > [Time Zone/DST]

Using a Memory Card

Memory Cards Compatible for Use with the Camcorder

You can use the following types of commercially available Secure Digital (SD) cards with this camcorder.

As of December 2012, the movie recording function has been tested using SD/SDHC/SDXC memory cards made by Panasonic, Toshiba and SanDisk. For the latest information on cards that can be used, visit your local Canon Web site.

Capacity: 128 MB or larger**.

- * When using an SD memory card without a speed class rating or one rated SD Speed Class 2, you may not be able to record movies, depending on the memory card used.
- **SD memory cards with a capacity of 64 MB or smaller cannot be used to record movies.



 About the Speed Class: Speed Class is a standard that indicates the minimum guaranteed data transfer speed of memory cards. When you buy a new memory card, look for the Speed Class logo on the package.

We recommend using memory cards rated SD Speed Class 4, 6 or 10.

SDXC Memory Cards

You can use SDXC memory cards with this camcorder. When using memory cards with other devices, such as digital recorders, computers and card readers, **make sure that the external device is compatible with SDXC cards**. For information about the compatibility of SDXC cards, contact the computer, operating system or memory card manufacturer.



- If you use an SDXC memory card with a computer OS that is not SDXC-compatible, you may be
 prompted to format the memory card. In such case, cancel the operation to prevent data loss.
- After repeatedly recording, deleting and editing scenes (fragmented memory), it will take longer to
 write data on the memory and recording may stop. Save your recordings and initialize the memory
 using the camcorder.


This product is not guaranteed to support Eye-Fi card functions (including wireless transfer). In case of an issue with an Eye-Fi card, please check with the card manufacturer.

Also note that an approval is required to use Eye-Fi cards in many countries or regions. Without approval, use of the card is not permitted. If it is unclear whether the card has been approved for use in the area, please check with the card manufacturer.

Inserting and Removing a Memory Card

Make sure to initialize (36) all memory cards before using them with this camcorder.

- 1 Turn off the camcorder.
 - Make sure the ON/OFF (CHG) indicator is off.
- 2 Open the double memory card slot cover.
- 3 Insert the memory card straight, with the label facing the front of the camcorder, all the way into one of the memory card slots until it clicks.
 - You can also use two memory cards, one in each memory card slot.
- 4 Close the double memory card slot cover.
 - Do not force the cover closed if the memory card is not correctly inserted.



To remove the memory card

Push the memory card once to release it. When the memory card springs out, pull it all the way out.

 - Do not remove the memory card.

At the time of purchase, the built-in memory comes pre-initialized and contains music files for use as background music and images for use with the image mix function (image mix frames).






- Under certain conditions, the Smart AUTO icon that appears on the screen may not match the
 actual scene. Especially when shooting against orange or blue backgrounds, the sunset or one of
 the blue skies icons may appear and the colors may not look natural. In such case, we recommend
 recording in mode (42).
- Photos are recorded as JPG files. The photo size (1920x1080) and quality cannot be changed. At
 this size, a 1 GB memory card can hold approximately 670 photos. However, the actual number of



- When you need to record for a long time with the camcorder set on a tripod (a school recital, for example), you can close the LCD panel and use only the viewfinder in order to save power when using a battery pack (\sum 22).

Quick Start Function

When you close the LCD panel with the camcorder on, the camcorder enters the standby mode. In standby mode the camcorder consumes only about 1/3 the power used when recording, saving energy when you are using a battery pack. Additionally, when you open the LCD panel or pull out the viewfinder, the camcorder is ready to start recording in approximately 1 second*, allowing you to record the subject right away.

* The actual time required varies depending on the shooting conditions.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA

- 1 With the camcorder on and in a recording mode, close the LCD panel.
 - A beep will sound and the green ON/OFF (CHG) indicator will change to orange to indicate the camcorder entered standby mode.
 - When using only the viewfinder (with the LCD panel closed), you can return the viewfinder to its retracted position to set the camcorder in standby mode.
- 2 When you wish to resume recording, open the LCD panel.
 - The ON/OFF (CHG) indicator turns back green and the camcorder is ready to record.
 - You can also pull out the viewfinder to start recording with the LCD panel closed.
- IMPORTANT
- Do not disconnect the power source during standby mode (while the ON/OFF (CHG) indicator is lit
 in orange).
- i NOTES
- The camcorder will not enter standby mode while the ACCESS indicator is on or flashing, while the setup menus are being displayed or while using the viewfinder. The camcorder may also not enter standby mode when the battery charge is too low. Check that the ON/OFF (CHG) indicator changes to orange.
- · About standby mode and auto power off:
 - The camcorder will power off automatically if left in standby mode for 10 minutes. Press POWER to turn on the camcorder.
 - You can select the length of time until auto power off or turn off the Quick Start function altogether with the Power Saving Mode
 [Quick Start (Standby)] setting.
 - The usual 5-minute auto power off setting of [Power Saving Mode] is not applicable while the camcorder is in standby mode.
- Changing the position of the mode switch while the camcorder is in standby mode will reactivate the camcorder in the operating mode selected.

Selecting the Video Quality (Recording Mode)

The camcorder offers 5 recording modes. Changing the recording mode will change the recording time available on the memory. Select MXP or FXP mode for better movie quality; select LP mode for longer recording times. The following table gives approximate recording times.

- 1 Open the [Recording Mode] screen.

 [FUNC.] ▶ [MENU] ▶ ▶ [Recording Mode]
- 2 Touch the desired recording mode and then touch [X].



- Movies recorded in MXP mode cannot be saved on AVCHD discs. Use an external Blu-ray Disc recorder to copy MXP movies onto Blu-ray discs or use the supplied software VideoBrowser to create AVCHD discs*.
- The camcorder uses a variable bit rate (VBR) to encode video so the actual recording times will vary
 depending on the content of the scenes.
- The camcorder retains the last setting used even if you set the camcorder to AUTO mode.
 - * MXP scenes will be converted to an image quality similar to that of FXP scenes.

Selecting the Frame Rate

You can change the frame rate (the number of frames recorded per second) to change the look of your movies.





1 Open the [Frame Rate] screen.

2 Touch the desired frame rate and then touch [X].

Options

[60i 60i (Standard)] 60 fields per second, interlaced. Standard frame rate of NTSC analog TV signals.

[PF30] PF30] Shooting at 30 frames per second, progressive*. Use this frame rate to easily edit your recordings, for example, to post them on the Web.

[PF24] PF241 Shooting at 24 frames per second, progressive*. Using this frame rate will give your recordings a cinematic look. Recording in [CNEMA] mode will further enhance the effect.

24 frames per second, progressive. Using this frame rate will achieve the same cinematic look as [PF24] PF24], the difference being that video is recorded as true 24p.

* Recorded as 60i.

NOTES

Movies recorded with the [24P] frame rate cannot be converted to standard definition using the camcorder. If you want to upload your movies to video sharing Web sites, set the frame rate to [PF24] PF24] or convert the movies to standard definition using the supplied software VideoBrowser.

Focus ring

Focus Adjustment

You can adjust the focus manually and use the peaking function to assist you or you can let the camcorder focus for you by using autofocus. With autofocus, you can set the autofocus speed. The camcorder also features two more focusing functions, face detection and Touch & Track.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA



• Adjust the zoom before you start the procedure.

Manual Focus

Use the focus ring to focus manually. You can also use peaking to help you focus more accurately.

AF/MF

1 Open the focus controls.

[FUNC.] > [O Focus]

- 2 Touch [MF].
- 3 Touch a subject that appears inside the **()** frame.
 - The Touch AF mark (**,) will flash and the focusing distance will be adjusted automatically. You have the option to further adjust the focus manually as necessary.
- 4 If necessary, turn the focus ring to further adjust the focus.
 - The center of the screen will be magnified to help you focus more easily. You can also turn off this
 function with the [Focus Assistance] setting.
 - The focusing distance displayed will change as you adjust the focus. You can change the units
 used for the distance display with the Distance Units] setting.
 - You can use the (Focus Ring Response) setting to adjust the sensitivity of the focus ring.

Focus Preset

When focusing manually, you can set a preset position for the focus in advance so that you can later return to that preset focus position instantly.

1 Open the focus controls.

[FUNC.] > [Focus]

- 2 Touch [MF].
- 3 Use Touch AF or turn the focus ring to obtain the desired focus position.
- 4 Touch [SET] to set the preset focus position.

- 5 After adjusting the focus, touch [ON] to return to the preset focus position.
 - Touch [SET] again to cancel the current preset focus position.
 - [ON] will be grayed out while adjusting the focus or zoom.
- i NOTES
- The preset focus position will be canceled when the camcorder is turned off.
- When the camcorder is in [AUTO] mode, the focus preset function cannot be used.

Peaking

When peaking is activated, the edges of objects in focus will be highlighted in red, blue or yellow on the screen. In addition, you can choose to switch the screen to black & white, further emphasizing the edges.

1 Open the focus controls.

[FUNC.] D [O Focus]

2 Touch [1/2].

For the black & white setting: Touch [Off] or [On] For the peaking color: Touch [Red], [Blue] or [Yellow]

- 3 Touch [♠].
- 4 Touch [PEAK].
 - Peaking is activated and edges are highlighted. You can turn the focus ring on this screen or touch [X] to hide the focus controls.
 - Touch [PEAK] again to turn off the peaking effect.
- i NOTES
- The peaking effect and black & white picture will not appear in your recordings.

Autofocus

When autofocus is activated, the camcorder continuously adjusts the focus on the subject in the center of the screen. The focusing range is 2 cm (0.8 in.; at full wide-angle, measured from the front of the lens barrel) to ∞ and 60 cm (2 ft.; throughout the zoom range, measured from the front of the lens barrel) to ∞ . Perform the following procedure to set the autofocus speed.

1 Open the [AF Mode] screen.

- 2 Touch the desired option and then touch [X].
 - The icon of the selected option appears on the screen.

Options (* Default value)

[LAF Instant AF] • Sets the autofocus to Instant AF. The focus is adjusted at the highest speed. This mode is useful even when recording in very bright or low-light surroundings. This mode uses both the TTL system and external sensor for focusing.

[MAF Medium AF] Sets the autofocus to Medium AF. The camcorder focuses more smoothly on the subject than when using the [LAF Instant AF] setting. This mode uses both the TTL system and external sensor for focusing.

[AF] Normal AF] Sets the autofocus to Normal AF. The autofocus adjustment is made at a stable speed.



- When you set 🗐 🔊 [Conversion Lens] to a setting other than [OFF Off], the [LAF] Instant AF] and [MAF] Medium AF] settings are not available.
- Autofocus takes longer to focus when the frame rate is set to [PF30 PF30], [PF24 PF24] or [24P] than when it is set to [60i 60i (Standard)].
- When recording under dark conditions, the focusing range narrows and the picture may appear blurred.
- While using autofocus, you can turn the manual ring to focus manually. When you stop turning the
 ring, the camcorder returns to autofocus. This is useful in situations such as when focusing on a
 subject on the other side of a window.
- Autofocus may not work well on the following subjects or in the following cases. In such case, focus
 manually.
 - Reflective surfaces
 - Subjects with low contrast or without vertical lines
 - Fast moving subjects
 - Through dirty or wet windows
 - Night scenes

Face Detection

The camcorder automatically detects people's faces and uses this information to select the optimal focus and exposure settings.

Operating modes: AUTO * M CINEMA P

* Face detection is always activated in AUTO mode.



Select a recording program other than [¾ Night Scene], [② Low Light], [※ Fireworks] or [M Manual Exposure].

By default, face detection is activated. If the function was turned off, perform the following procedure to turn it on.

- 1 Open the [Face Detection & Tracking] screen.

 [FUNC.] ▶ [MENU] ▶ [♣] ▶ [Face Detection & Tracking]
- 2 Touch [ON On [3]] and then touch [X].

To select the main subject

If there is more than one person in the picture, the camcorder will automatically select one person it determines is the main subject. The main subject is indicated by a white face-detection frame and the camcorder will optimize the settings for that person. Other faces will have gray frames.

Touch a different face on the touch screen to optimize the camcorder's settings for that person using the Touch & Track function.



Main subject

Limiting Autofocus to Faces

While using autofocus, you can limit the autofocus function only to cases when a subject's face is detected and use manual focus for all other scenes. The camcorder will also adjust the brightness when focusing automatically on the subject's face.

Set an assignable button to [Face Only AF] (S5) and press the button.

• 🔀 appears on the screen.



- The camcorder may mistakenly detect the faces of non-human subjects. In such case, turn face detection off.
- In certain cases, faces may not be detected correctly. Typical examples include:
 - Faces extremely small, large, dark or bright in relation to the overall picture.
 - Faces turned to the side, at a diagonal or partially hidden.
- Face detection cannot be used in the following cases.
 - When the shutter speed used is slower than 1/30 (1/24 if the frame rate is set to [PF24] or [24P] 24P]).
 - When the digital zoom is activated at more than 40x zoom (dark blue area on the zoom bar).
 - When [Scan Reverse Rec] is set to an option other than [Off Off].
- When face detection is activated, the slowest shutter speed used by the camcorder is 1/30 (1/24 if the frame rate is set to [PF24] PF24] or [24P] 24P]).

Touch & Track

When recording a group of people using face detection, the camcorder will automatically detect one person as the main subject. You can use Touch & Track to tell the camcorder to track and optimize settings for a different person. You can also use Touch & Track to always keep in focus other moving subjects, such as pets or moving vehicles.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA D

- 1 Make sure face detection (49) and autofocus (48) are activated.
 - Face detection is always activated in AUTO mode.
- 2 Point the camcorder at a moving subject and touch the subject on the touch screen.
 - A white double frame will appear around the subject and track it as it moves.
 - Touch [Cancel []] to remove the frame and cancel the tracking.



- Touching somewhere with a color or pattern unique to the subject will make it easier to track.
 However, if there is another subject in the vicinity that shares similar characteristics to the selected
 subject, the camcorder may start tracking the incorrect subject. Touch the screen again to select
 the desired subject.
- In certain cases, Touch & Track may not be able to track the subject. Typical examples include:
 - Subjects extremely small or large in relation to the overall picture.
 - Subjects too similar to the background.
 - Subjects lacking sufficient contrast.
 - Fast moving subjects.
 - When shooting indoors with insufficient lighting.

Zooming

Operating modes:









There are three ways you can zoom in and out: using the zoom lever on the camcorder, using the zoom buttons on the wireless controller or using the zoom controls on the touch screen. In addition to the 10x optical zoom, in M mode, you can turn on the digital zoom* (40x or 200x) with the [Digital Zoom] setting.

This camcorder also features a digital tele-converter, which allows you to enlarge the image on the screen digitally.

* Digital zoom is not available in AUTO and CINEMA modes.

Using the Zoom Lever or Wireless Controller

Move the zoom lever toward **W** (wide angle) to zoom out. Move it toward **T** (telephoto) to zoom in.


- You can also use the zoom buttons on the wireless controller.
- By default, the zoom lever operates at a variable speed press gently for a slow zoom; press harder for faster zooms.

Setting the Zoom Speed

You can set the zoom speed for the zoom lever and wireless controller.

To set the zoom lever's zoom speed

For the zoom lever, first set the overall zoom speed to one of three levels. Next, select whether the zoom lever operates at a variable or constant speed. Refer to the following table for a summary of the zoom speed.



- 1 Open the [Zoom Speed Level] screen.
 - [FUNC.] [MENU] [X [Zoom Speed Level]
- 2 Touch [Fast], [Normal] or [Slow] and then touch [].
- 3 Touch [Zoom Lever Zoom Speed].
- 4 Touch [VAR] for variable speed or [CONST] for constant speed.
 - If you selected [(MSI)], touch [♠] or (♣) or drag your finger along the bar to select a constant speed.
- 5 Touch [X].

 - [FUNC.] ▶ [MENU] ▶ 📜 ▶ [Zoom Speed Level]
- 2 Touch [> Fast], [> Normal] or [> Slow] and then touch [△].
- 3 Touch [Wireless Ctrlr Zoom Speed].
- 4 Touch [♠] or [♣] or drag your finger along the bar to select the desired constant speed.
- 5 Touch [X].

Using the Touch Screen's Zoom Controls

- 1 Display the zoom controls on the touch screen. [FUNC.] ▶ [ZOOM]
 - The zoom controls appear on the left side of the screen.
- 2 Touch the zoom controls to operate the zoom.
 - Touch anywhere within the W area to zoom out or anywhere within the T area to zoom in. Touch closer to the center for a slow zoom; touch closer to the W/T icons for faster zooms.
- 3 Touch [X] to hide the zoom controls.

Soft Zoom Control

Soft zoom control allows you to start and/or stop the zoom gradually.

2 Touch the desired option and then touch [X].

Options (* Default value)

[OFF Off] ◆ Use this setting if you do not intend to use soft zoom control.

[START Start] Zoom starts gradually.

[SIOP Stop] Zoom stops gradually.

Start & Stop Zoom start and stops gradually.

Digital Tele-Converter

Using the digital tele-converter, you can digitally increase the focal length of the camcorder by a factor of approx. 2 and record the enlarged image at full HD resolution.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA P.

1 Open the [Digital Zoom] screen.

[FUNC.] ▶ [MENU] ▶ 📺 ▶ [Digital Zoom]

- 2 Touch [Digital Tele-conv.] and then touch [X].
- 3 Open the zoom controls.

[FUNC.] > [ZOOM]

- 4 Touch [Marging] (digital tele-converter) and then touch [X].
 - The center of the screen will be enlarged approximately 2 times and the Maicon will appear.
 - Touch [Mag] again before closing the screen to deactivate the digital tele-converter.

(i) NOTES

- You can attach the optional tele-converter and use it in conjunction with this function to increase the
 effect.
- The digital tele-converter cannot be turned on while recording.
- The image is digitally processed so the image will deteriorate throughout the zoom range.

Advanced Image Stabilization

The image stabilizer reduces camcorder blur (blur due to the camcorder moving) so you can get nice, stable shots. Select the image stabilization mode according to the shooting conditions.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA P

1 Open the [Image Stabilizer] screen.

[FUNC.] > [Image Stabilizer]

2 Touch the desired IS mode and then touch [X].

Options (* Default value)

[(Dynamic] Compensates for a higher degree of camcorder shake, such as when shooting while walking, and is more effective as the zoom approaches full wide angle.

[() Standard] Compensates for a lower degree of camcorder shake, such as when shooting while remaining stationary, and is suitable for shooting natural-looking scenes.

[(6]) Off] Use this setting when the camcorder is mounted on a tripod.

Powered IS

After setting an assignable button to [(I) Powered IS] (I) 85), you can use Powered IS to make the image stabilization even more powerful. Powered IS is most effective when you are stationary and zooming in on far subjects using high zoom ratios (the more you approach the telephoto end). Holding the LCD panel with your left hand will add to the stability of the shot.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA | PA

- 1 Set an assignable button to [(Powered IS] (S5).
- 2 Press and hold the assignable button as long as you want to activate Powered IS.
 - (4) appears in yellow while Powered IS is activated.
 - You can change the operation of the assignable button set to [(4) Powered IS] (long press
 or toggle on/off) with the POWERED IS Button] setting.
 - Powered IS is available even when [Image Stabilizer] is set to [6th) Off].

(i) NOTES

- If the degree of camcorder shake is too high, the image stabilizer may not be able to fully compensate.
- For surveying and following shots, when you pan the camcorder from side to side or tilt it up and down, we recommend setting [Image Stabilizer] to [(4) Dynamic] or [(4) Standard].

Automatic Gain Control (AGC) Limit

When recording in dark surroundings, the camcorder will automatically increase the gain to try to get a brighter picture. However, using higher gain values may result in more noticeable video noise. You can select the AGC limit to curb the amount of noise by setting the maximum gain value to be used. The smaller the AGC limit, the darker the picture but the less noise it will contain.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA DEPARTMENT



- Select a recording program other than the Special Scene recording programs or [M Manual Exposure].
- 1 Open the AGC limit adjustment screen.

[FUNC.] > [MG AGC Limit] > [M Manual]

- Touch [A Automatic] to remove the AGC limit.
- 2 Touch [◀] or [▶] to set the AGC limit.
 - · You can also drag your finger along the dial.
- 3 Touch [X].
 - The selected AGC limit will appear on the screen.



Automatic Exposure Recording Programs

With the automatic exposure (AE) recording programs, the camcorder will adjust the shutter speed and/or aperture value to obtain the optimal exposure. When using the AE recording programs, you can change functions like the white balance and image effects.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA

- 1 Open the screen of the desired recording program.

 [FUNC.] ▶ [Rec. Programs] ▶ [Tv Shutter-Pri. AE] or [Av Aperture-Pri. AE]
- 2 Touch [◀] or [▶] to set the desired shutter speed (Tv) or aperture value (Av) and then touch [★].
 - You can also drag your finger along the dial.
 - The selected shutter speed or aperture value will appear on the screen next to the recording program icon.

Options (* Default value)

[P Programmed AE] The camcorder automatically adjusts the aperture and shutter speed to obtain the optimal exposure for the subject.

[TV Shutter-Pri. AE] Set the shutter speed value. The camcorder automatically sets the appropriate aperture value.

[AV Aperture-Pri. AE] Set the aperture value. The camcorder automatically sets the appropriate shutter speed.

Automatic Exposure Recording Programs

- (i) NOTES
- [Tv Shutter-Pri. AE]:
 - On screen only the denominator is displayed [TV 250] indicates a shutter speed of 1/250 second, etc.
 - When recording in dark surroundings, you can obtain a brighter picture by using slow shutter speeds; however, image quality may not be as good and autofocus may not work well.
 - The image may flicker when recording with fast shutter speeds.
 - Recording movies under fluorescent lights: If the screen starts to flicker, select [Tv Shutter-Pri. AE] and set the shutter speed to 1/100.
- [AV Aperture-Pri. AE]: The actual range of values available for selection will vary depending on the initial zoom position.
- When setting a numeric value (aperture or shutter speed), the number displayed will flash if the
 aperture value or shutter speed is not appropriate for the recording conditions. In such case, select
 a different value.
- During exposure lock, the aperture value/shutter speed cannot be changed. Set the aperture value
 or shutter speed before manually adjusting the exposure.

Exposure Adjustment


At times, backlit subjects may appear too dark (underexposed) or subjects under very strong lights may appear too bright or glaring (overexposed). In such cases, adjusting the exposure will correct this. This camcorder features a dedicated recording program, [**M** Manual Exposure], for adjusting the exposure manually. However, you can also compensate the exposure when using other recording programs.

Using the Manual Exposure Recording Program

Using the [\mathbf{M} Manual Exposure] recording program, you can adjust the aperture, shutter speed and gain to achieve the desired exposure.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA

- 1 Activate the [**M** Manual Exposure] recording program. [FUNC.] **▶** [Rec. Programs] **▶** [**M** Manual Exposure]
- 2 Touch the control button of the setting you wish to adjust.



- 3 Touch [◀] or [▶] to set the desired value.
 - You can also drag your finger along the dial.
 - The exposure will change according to the setting's new value. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to adjust other settings.
 - Before touching [X], you can also use the zebra pattern (see below) and waveform monitor (☐ 79).
- 4 Touch [X].
- (i) NOTES
- If you set (2) [Custom Key/Dial] to [M] Manual Exposure] ((2) 84), you can adjust the aperture, shutter speed and gain with the CUSTOM dial.

Using the Zebra Pattern

You can use the zebra pattern to identify areas that might be overexposed, so you can correct the exposure appropriately. The camcorder offers two levels of zebra pattern: With 100% only areas that will lose detail in the highlight areas will be identified, while 70% will identify also areas that are dangerously close to losing detail.

- 1 From the exposure adjustment screen, touch [] to select the zebra level.
- 2 Touch [70%] or [100%] and then touch [♠].
- 3 Touch $[\overline{W_70}]$ or $[\overline{W_100}]$ and then touch $[\times]$.
 - The zebra pattern will appear on the overexposed areas of the picture.
 - Touch again to turn off the zebra pattern.



Using the zebra pattern will not affect your recordings.

Exposure Compensation

When you use a recording program other than [M Manual Exposure], the camcorder will adjust the exposure automatically. However, you can compensate and lock the exposure or use the Touch AE function to automatically set the optimal exposure for the subject you select. This is convenient when the brightness of the subject you want to shoot is noticeably brighter/darker than the general brightness of the image.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA



- Select a recording program other than [※ Fireworks] or [M Manual Exposure].
- 1 Open the exposure adjustment screen.

[FUNC.] > [Exposure]

- 2 Touch a subject that appears inside the **½** frame.
 - The Touch AE mark (*\(\bilde{\chi}\)) will flash and the exposure will be adjusted automatically so the area you
 touched will be correctly exposed. You have the option to further adjust the exposure manually as
 necessary. Depending on the subject, you may want to use the [Highlights] setting as described
 below.
 - You can touch [M] instead to compensate the exposure without activating the Touch AE function.
 - The manual adjustment dial appears and the adjustment value is set at ± 0 .
 - Touch [M] again to return the camcorder to automatic exposure.
- 3 Touch [◀] or [▶] or drag your finger along the dial to set the exposure compensation value.
 - The adjustment range may vary depending on the initial brightness of the image, and some values may be grayed out.
 - Before touching [X], you can also use the zebra pattern (☐ 59) and waveform monitor (☐ 79).
- 4 Touch [X] to lock the exposure at the selected value.
 - During exposure lock,
 and the selected exposure compensation value will appear on the screen.

To adjust the Touch AE function for highlights (Highlight AE)

Certain subjects, like clouds or white objects, are easily overexposed and can end up appearing as bright areas where all detail is lost. Using the [Highlights] setting, you can touch the brightest area inside the frame and the camcorder will automatically make corrections so that area is not overexposed. When you touch a dark area in the picture or the highlights are too bright, the camcorder may not be able to correctly adjust the exposure.

After step 1 above:

- 1 Touch [**'**].
- 2 Touch [Highlights] and then touch [5].
 - Touch [Normal] to return the camcorder to normal Touch AE settings.

To use backlight correction

When recording in situations in which the subject is constantly backlit, you can use backlight correction to make the entire picture brighter, especially dark areas. This will take precedence over the [Immail] [Auto Backlight Correction] setting, which is useful in situations in which the subject is not constantly backlit.

- 1 Open the [* BLC Always On] screen. [FUNC.] ▶ [* BLC Always On]
- 2 Touch [ON On] and then touch [X].

(i) NOTES

- If the recording program is changed during exposure lock, the camcorder will return to automatic exposure.
- You can adjust the exposure compensation value with the CUSTOM dial (84), which is set to Exposure by default.

White Balance

The white balance function helps you to accurately reproduce colors under different lighting conditions

Operating modes:







POINTS TO CHECK

- Select a recording program other than the Special Scene recording programs.
- 1 Open the white balance screen.

[FUNC.] > [WB White Balance]

- 2 Touch the desired option and then touch [X].
 - When you select [K Color Temperature], [♣1 Set 1] or [♣2 Set 2], set the color temperature or a
 custom white balance with the appropriate procedure below before touching [★].
 - The icon of the selected option will appear on the screen.

To set the color temperature ([K Color Temperature])

Touch [◀] or [▶] to set the desired value.

• You can also drag your finger along the dial.

To set a custom white balance ([№1 Set 1] or [№2 Set 2])

Point the camcorder at a white object, so it fills the whole screen, and touch [Set WB].

When the adjustment is completed, 🛂 stops flashing and disappears. The camcorder will retain the custom white balance even if you turn it off.

Options (* Default value)

[AWB Automatic] The camcorder automatically sets the white balance for natural looking colors.

[Daylight] To record outdoors on a bright day.

[a Shade] To record in shaded places.

[Cloudy] To record on a cloudy day.

[**#Fluorescent**] To record under warm white, cool white or warm-white-type (3-wavelength) fluorescent lighting.

[端 Fluorescent H] To record under daylight or daylight-type (3-wavelength) fluorescent lighting.

[* Tungsten] To record under tungsten and tungsten-type (3-wavelength) fluorescent lighting.

[K Color Temperature] Allows you to set the color temperature between 2,000 K and 15,000 K.

[1.1 Set 1], [1.2 Set 2] Use the custom white balance settings to make white subjects appear white under colored lighting.



- When you select a custom white balance:
 - Set 🖳 🔊 [Digital Zoom] to [OFF Off].
 - Reset the white balance when you change locations or the lighting or other conditions change.
 - Depending on the light source, ♣ may keep flashing. The result will still be better than with [AMB Automatic].

- Using a custom white balance may provide better results in the following cases:
 - Changing lighting conditions
 - Close-ups
 - Subjects in a single color (sky, sea or forest)
 - Under mercury lamps, certain types of fluorescent lights and LED lights

Special Scene Recording Programs

Recording in a very bright ski resort or capturing the full colors of a sunset or a fireworks display becomes as easy as selecting a Special Scene recording program.

1 Open the **SCN** recording programs screen.

[FUNC.] ▶ [Rec. Programs] ▶ [SCN ♠ Portrait]

2 Touch the desired recording program and then touch [X].

The camcorder uses a large aperture, to achieve a sharp focus on the subject while blurring the background.



[Sports To record sports scenes such as tennis or golf.



「4』Night Scene To record nightscapes with lower noise.



[*8 Snow] To record in bright ski resorts without the subject being underexposed.



[🥱 Beach] To record on a sunny beach without the subject being underexposed.



[Sunset] To record sunsets in vibrant colors.



[Low Light] To record in low-light situations.



[A Spotlight] To record spotlit scenes.



[※Fireworks] To record fireworks.



(i) NOTES

- [Portrait]/[Sports]/[Sommon Beach]: The picture may not appear smooth during playback.
- [Portrait]: The blur effect of the background increases the more you zoom in (T).
- [* Snow]/[Some Beach]: The subject may become overexposed on cloudy days or in shaded places. Check the image on the screen.
- [Low Light]:
 - Moving subjects may leave a trailing afterimage.
 - Picture quality may not be as good as in other modes.
 - White points may appear on the screen.
 - Autofocus may not work as well as in other modes. In such case, adjust the focus manually.
- [* Fireworks]: To avoid camcorder blur (blur due to the camcorder moving) we recommend using a tripod.

Image Effects

You can adjust the color depth, brightness, contrast, and sharpness of the image.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA

POINTS TO CHECK

- Select a recording program other than the Special Scene recording programs.
- 1 Open the image effects screen.

[FUNC.] > [Image Effects]

- 2 Touch [ON] and then touch [Color Depth], [Sharpness], [Contrast] or [Brightness].
 - · Select [OFF] to turn off the image effects.
- 3 Touch [◀] or [▶] or drag your finger along the dial to adjust the effect level.
 - + levels: richer colors, sharper image, stronger contrast, brighter image.
 - levels: shallower colors, softer image, softer contrast, darker image.
 - To adjust other parameters, touch [5] to return to the image effects screen. Touch the desired control button and repeat step 3.
- 4 Touch [X] to save and apply the customized picture settings.
 - Ac will appear on the screen.

Self Timer

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA *

Movies: In record pause mode, press START/STOP on the camcorder or wireless controller. The camcorder starts recording after a 10-second countdown*. The countdown appears on the screen.

Photos: In record pause mode, touch [PHOTO] or press PHOTO on the wireless controller. The camcorder will record the photo after a 10-second countdown*. The countdown appears on the screen.

* 2 seconds when using the wireless controller.



- Once the countdown has begun, any of the following actions will cancel the self timer.
 - Pressing START/STOP, when recording movies.
 - Pressing PHOTO (on the wireless controller) or touching [PHOTO] (on the screen), when recording photos.
 - Turning off the camcorder.
 - Changing the camcorder's operating mode.
 - Closing the LCD panel to set the camcorder to standby mode.

You can have the camcorder optimize the audio settings of the built-in microphone by selecting the audio scene that matches your surroundings. This will greatly enhance the sense of "being there". Alternatively, you can select [**\frac{1}{2}c** Custom Setting*] in order to adjust the camcorder's various audio settings to your liking.

 - When [Mark Mix] is set to [ON On], two audio level indicators will appear; the top one ([INT]) for the built-in microphone, and the bottom one ([EXT]) for the external audio.

Usually, the audio level indicator will be displayed only after activating the manual adjustment of the audio recording level. You can choose to display it also when the audio level is adjusted automatically.

Built-In Microphone Directionality

You can change the directionality of the built-in microphone to have more control over how sound is recorded.

- 1 Open the [Built-in Mic Directionality] screen.

Options (* Default value)

Monaural Mono recording that emphasizes sound coming from the front of the camcorder/microphone.

[NORM Normal] Standard stereo recording; a middle point between the [Will Wide] and [Will Monaural] settings in reach.

[Wide] Stereo recording of ambient sound over a more extensive area that adds to the sense of presence of movies.

Zoom Stereo recording with the sound linked to the zoom position. The larger the subject appears on the screen, the louder the sound will be.

(i) NOTES

- Except when using the audio mix function, an external microphone overrides the built-in microphone. In the following cases, the built-in microphone's directionality cannot be changed.
 - When an external microphone is connected to the MIC terminal with ▶ [Audio Mix] set to Off].
 - When an external microphone is attached to the mini advanced shoe.

Audio Equalizer

You can use the audio equalizer to adjust sound levels by specifically targeting the high- or low-frequency range and selecting one of 3 available levels. The audio equalizer settings are only available when recording sound using the built-in microphone.

Normal Appropriate for balanced sound under most normal recording conditions.

[MB Boost MF Range] Best for recording human voices and dialog.

[LHB] Boost HF+LF Range] Best, for example, for recording live music and clearly capture the special sound characteristics of a variety of instruments.

Auto Wind Screen

The camcorder automatically reduces the background sound of wind when recording outdoors. You can select from two levels or turn off the auto wind screen.



- Set [AUDIO Audio Scene] to [♪c Custom Setting] (☐ 68).
- 1 Open the [Auto Wind Screen] screen.
 [FUNC.] → [MENU] → □ (Auto Wind Screen]
- 2 Touch the desired wind screen level and then touch [X].

i NOTES

 Some low-frequency sounds will be suppressed along with the sound of wind. When recording in surroundings unaffected by wind or if you want to record low-frequency sounds, we recommend setting [Auto Wind Screen] to [OFF Off *> 0. When recording, you can mix audio from the built-in microphone with external audio from the MIC terminal and adjust the mix balance for original sound effects. 

Using Headphones

Do not connect the headphones to the AV OUT/ Ω terminal if the Ω icon does not appear on the screen. The noise output in such case may be harmful to your hearing.

 - When a compatible accessory is attached to the mini advanced shoe, ** will appear on the screen.

Using an External Microphone

When recording in very quiet surroundings, the built-in microphone may pick up the sound of the camcorder's internal machinery. When recording outside, the built-in microphone may pick up excessive noise from wind. In such cases, we recommend using an external microphone with a wind screen.

Using the SM-V1 Surround Microphone or DM-100 Directional Stereo Microphone

Using the SM-V1* you can add a sense of depth and presence to your recordings with 5.1ch surround sound. Using the DM-100 you can accurately record audio coming directly from the direction you are recording. In either case, to reduce the amount of noise due to wind, we recommend that you use the wind screen supplied with the microphone.


* When you use the optional SM-V1 Surround Microphone with this camcorder for the first time, you will need to update the camcorder's firmware using the memory card supplied with the SM-V1.



Using the WM-V1 Wireless Microphone

Using the WM-V1 you can reliably record sound even when recording subjects at a distance exceeding the practical range of the built-in microphone. You can also mix and record audio from the WM-V1 with audio from the built-in microphone. For details about using the WM-V1, refer to the instruction manual supplied with the microphone.

Color Bars/Audio Reference Signal

You can have the camcorder output and record color bars and a 1 kHz audio reference signal.

[Color Bars] Displays a standard SMPTE color bar pattern.

[Color Bars & Tone] In addition to the color bar pattern, an audio reference signal is output.

Video Scopes

The camcorder can display a simplified waveform monitor. It can also display an edge monitor* to help you focus. The video scopes appear only on the LCD screen. They do not appear in the viewfinder or on an external monitor.

* The edge monitor looks at the focus of the entire picture and displays the results as a waveform.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA

 - When the camcorder stops recording, the screen will momentarily turn black as if a camera shutter had released.



Pre-Recording

The camcorder will start recording 3 seconds before you press START/STOP, ensuring you do not miss important shooting opportunities. This is especially useful when it is difficult to predict when to start recording.



Onscreen Displays and Data Code

You can turn most onscreen displays on or off.

Repeatedly press DISP. to turn the onscreen displays on/off in the following sequence:

About the Data Code

Faders

The camcorder offers two professional looking transition effects to fade-in or fade-out scenes. You have the option to activate the fader only one time or every time you start or stop recording.







Adjusting the volume

- 2 Touch [♬♠], drag your finger along the [Speaker Volume] bar to adjust the volume and touch [♠].

During playback pause:

- 2 Slow playback* backward/forward.

- Depending on the recording conditions, you may notice brief stops in video or sound playback between scenes.
- During fast/slow playback, you may notice some anomalies (blocky video artifacts, banding, etc.) in the playback picture.
- The speed indicated on the screen is approximate.
- Slow reverse playback will look the same as continuous frame reverse.

3D Flip View

Touch [image | in the date index screen to switch to 3D Flip View. This convenient way of displaying scenes grouped by recording date in a 3D layout can be useful to flip through a large number of recordings.



- 1 Recording date.

- 3 Drag your finger up and down to browse through the scenes recorded in the displayed date.

Two playback modes: the date index screen vs. the gallery

In the **date index screen** you can find all the movies you have recorded, conveniently organized by recording date. When you play back scenes from the date index screen, they will be played back in chronological order.

In the **gallery**, you can find your scenes grouped as video stories. If you record movies using the Story Creator function (\square 99), your scenes will appear in the story you created; scenes recorded without using this function will appear in the [Unsorted] story (or [Video Snapshot] story, in the case of video snapshot scenes). When you play back a story from the gallery, scenes will be played back in the order of the story's outline, regardless of their recording date.

Deleting Scenes and Stories

You can delete those scenes and stories that you are not interested in keeping. Deleting scenes allows you also to free up space on the memory.

Deleting a story permanently deletes all the scenes it contains. The two preexisting stories, [Unsorted] and [Video Snapshot], cannot be deleted.

- Be careful when deleting recordings. Once deleted, scenes cannot be recovered.
- Deleting a story permanently deletes all the scenes it contains.
- When deleting scenes, scenes will be removed from the date index screen and from any stories in the gallery they may have belonged to, regardless of the method used to delete them.
- Save copies of important scenes before deleting them (127).
- Observe the following precautions while the ACCESS indicator is on or flashing (while scenes are being deleted).
 - Do not open the double memory card slot cover.
 - Do not disconnect the power source or turn off the camcorder.
 - Do not change the camcorder's operating mode.

Dividing Scenes

You can divide scenes in order to leave out the best parts and later cut out the rest.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA PRODUCTION DE LA CINEMA

- 1 Play back the scene you want to divide.
- 2 Pause the playback at the point where you want to divide the scene.
- 3 Open the scene division screen.

[Edit] (Divide)

- 4 Bring the scene to a precise point, if necessary.
 - Playback controls will appear on the screen (
 \sum 88). Use any special playback modes (fast playback, frame reverse/advance) as necessary to locate the desired point.
- 5 Divide the scene.
 - [≯ Divide] ▶ [Yes]
 - The video from the division point to the end of the scene will appear as a new scene in the index screen.



- When advancing/reversing frames while dividing the scenes, the interval between frames is about 0.5 seconds.
- If the scene cannot be divided at the point where you paused the playback, advance/reverse a
 frame and then divide the scene.
- During the playback of a scene that was divided, you may notice some anomalies in the picture/ sound at the point where the scene was cut.
- The following scenes cannot be divided:
 - Scenes that are too short (less than 3 seconds).
 - Scenes that were edited using the supplied software VideoBrowser and were then transferred back to the camcorder.
- Scenes cannot be divided within 1 second from the beginning or the end of the scene.

Selecting the Playback Starting Point

If you have a very long scene, you may want to start playing back the scene from a certain point. You can use the movie timeline to break the scene to segments at fixed time intervals ranging from 6 seconds to 6 minutes.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA P. CINEMA

- 1 Open the date index screen (QQ 91).
- 2 Open the scene's [Timeline] screen.
 - [i] Desired scene

- The [Timeline] screen appears. The large thumbnail will show the first frame of the scene. Below it, the timeline ruler shows frames taken from the scene at fixed intervals.
- 3 Touch the desired frame in the timeline ruler to start playing back the scene from that point.

- ² Previous/next scene.
- 3 Drag your finger left along the ruler to display the next 5 frames.

To change the interval between frames

Capturing Video Snapshot Scenes and Photos from a Movie

You can capture video snapshot scenes, single photos or a series of continuous photos from a previously recorded scene. For example, you may want to print photos from video recorded at a party or create a small video clip using video snapshot scenes from the highlights of an event.

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA

Capturing a Video Snapshot Scene

- 1 Play back the scene or story from which you want to capture the video snapshot scene.
- 2 Press START/STOP to capture the video snapshot scene.
 - The camcorder captures the video snapshot scene for about 4 seconds (the blue frame serves as
 a visual progress bar), and then enters playback pause mode. You can change the length of the
 video snapshot scenes you capture to 2 or 8 seconds with the (Video Snapshot
 Length) setting.
- 3 Touch [■] to stop the playback.
- (i) NOTES
- A video snapshot scene can be captured only during playback; it cannot be captured during playback pause mode.
- The captured video snapshot scene is saved to the same memory that contains the source scene.
- Video snapshot scenes cannot be captured from any of the following types of scenes.
 - Scenes shorter than 1 second.
 - Scenes that were edited using the supplied software VideoBrowser and were then transferred back to the camcorder.
- When the source scene is itself a video snapshot scene, you may not be able to capture a video snapshot scene depending on the length of the source scene and the length currently selected for video snapshot scenes.
- When you start capturing a video snapshot scene less than 1 second from the end of the scene, the video snapshot scene will be captured starting from the beginning of the following scene.
- During the playback of video snapshot scenes captured from a previously recorded movie, you may
 notice some anomalies in the picture/sound at the point where the playback switches to a new
 scene.

You can capture a single photo or a series of photos. The size of the captured photos will be 1920x1080 and it cannot be changed.

Please read the IMPORTANT section (98) before using an Eye-Fi card.

To select the photo capture settings

- 1 Open the [Photo Capture from Video] screen.
 - [MENU] > [Photo Capture from Video]
- 2 Touch [☐ Single Photo] or [☐ Photo Sequence] and then touch [X].

To capture the photos

- 1 Play back the scene or story from which you want to capture the photo.
- 2 Pause the playback at the point you want to capture.
- 3 Touch [PHOTO].
 - To capture a photo sequence, keep touching [PHOTO]. The scene will be played back frame-byframe and each frame captured as a separate photo.
- 4 Touch [■] to stop the playback.



(i) NOTES

- The data code of the photos will reflect the date and time of recording of the original scene.
- Photos captured from a scene with a lot of fast movement may be blurred.
- Photos will be recorded on the memory selected for recording photos.
- [Photo Sequence]:
 - Up to 100 photos can be captured at a time.
 - The photo sequence capture will stop when the end of the scene is reached (playback will pause at the beginning of the following scene).
 - Photos will be captured at intervals of 1/30 second (1/24 second, if the scene was recorded at a frame rate of [PF24 PF24] or [24P 24P]).

Using Story Creator to Create Video Stories

Story Creator is a helpful function that offers suggestions for typical scenes in a number of situations. With Story Creator, creating a video story with a structured yet interesting storyline is as easy as selecting one of the story themes, such as [Travel], [Kids & Pets] or [Blog], and following the suggested categories to record video. You can even select [Unrestricted] to group recordings as a single story without following the other storylines. During playback, select your story from the gallery to play back the scenes you recorded as a single, compelling video story (\(\sum \text{10}\) 107).

Creating a New Story

1 Start Story Creator mode.

[FUNC.] ▶ [□ Story Creator]

- Alternatively, you can set an assignable button to [\$\sum_{\begin{subarray}{c} \top} \text{Story Creator}\$] (\$\sum_{\begin{subarray}{c} \top} \text{85}\$).
- If the memory already contains other stories, the story selection screen will appear. In that case, touch [New Story].
- 2 Select the desired theme.
 - Drag your finger left/right to browse through the themes and touch the thumbnail of the desired theme.
 - A list of the suggested categories (story scenes) for the selected theme will appear.
- 3 Drag your finger up/down to select a category and touch [OK].


In mode, the camcorder will adjust the frame rate and several other picture-related settings to give your recordings a cinematic look. In this mode you can also use a variety of professional cinemalook filters to create unique movies with a distinctive appearance.







- 1 Set the mode switch to CINFMA.



Adding Decorations

Using the decoration function, you can add various graphical elements to the picture, such as stamps, watermarks, the date/time, and even your own freehand drawings. Freehand drawings can help emphasize a portion of the picture to attract viewers' attention. The supplied stylus pen will be especially useful for adding decorations.


You can decorate scenes as they are being recorded, during playback or when converting them to standard definition.



Decorating Scenes while Recording

Operating modes: AUTO M CINEMA P. CINEMA

- 1 Open the decoration screen.
 - [FUNC.] ▶ [Ø Decoration]
 - When 🕝 🔊 [Autostart Decoration] is set to [ON On] (default value), the decoration screen will open automatically also when you stow the LCD panel with the touch screen facing out.

 - You can add decorations even while recording a scene.

 In playback mode: pause the playback. Touch [►] to resume playing back the scene.
- [3] [¬►] Minimize the toolbar to the top of the screen to view almost all of the canvas. Touch [♠_] to restore the toolbar.

To use [Pens and Stamps]

 - The main decoration screen will appear again.
- 3 Draw freely on the canvas.

 - To load a previously saved canvas (freehand drawings and stamps only) from the built-in memory:

To use [Animated Stamps]

 - The [Animated Stamps] screen will appear.
- 2 Touch one of the control buttons.

To use [Captions]

 - The [Captions] screen will appear.
- 2 Touch [Date] or [Time].
 - When recording a scene using Story Creator, you can also select [Title] (the story's title) or [Story Scene] (the story scene category).

 - Touch [A] (white text on dark background), [A] (white text) or [A] (black text).
 - The selected caption will appear on the screen.

Regular scenes and video snapshot scenes recorded without using Story Creator, will appear in the gallery under the [Unsorted] or [Video Snapshot] stories. If the external digital video recorder has an SD memory card slot*, you can use the memory card to copy your movies without connecting the camcorder.

* Make sure the external device is compatible with the type of memory card used.



[HDMI 1080p Output]: If set to [**ON** On], when the camcorder is connected using the supplied High Speed HDMI cable to an HDTV that supports the 1080p standard, your video recordings (made in 1080i) will be converted and output as 1080p.

[HDMI Status]: Displays a screen where you can verify the standard of the output signal from the HDMI OUT terminal.

[Distance Units]: Selects the units to use for the focusing distance display during manual focus.


[Demo Mode]: The demonstration mode displays the camcorder's main features. It starts automatically when the camcorder is powered with the compact power adapter if you leave it turned on without a memory card for more than 5 minutes.

To cancel the demo mode once it has started, press any button or turn off the camcorder.

[Firmware]: You can verify the current version of the camcorder's firmware. This menu option is usually unavailable.

Troubleshooting

If you have a problem with your camcorder, refer to this section. Sometimes what you think is a malfunction of the camcorder may have the simplest of solutions - please read the "CHECK THIS FIRST" box before going on to the more detailed problems and solutions. Consult your dealer or a Canon Service Center if the problem persists.

CHECK THIS FIRST

Power supply

Is the battery charged? Is the compact power adapter correctly connected to the camcorder?
 (\sum 20)

Recording

Playback

Did you turn the camcorder on and correctly set it to playback mode? (
 \$\sum 87, 120\$) If you are playing back recordings from a memory card, is one correctly inserted into the camcorder?
 (
 \$\sum 34\$) Does it contain any recordings?

Other

 Does the camcorder make a rattling sound? The internal lens fixture can move when the camcorder is turned off or in a playback mode. This is not a malfunction.

Power source

The camcorder will not turn on or it turns off by itself.

- The battery pack is exhausted. Replace or charge the battery pack.
- Remove the battery pack and reattach it correctly.

Cannot charge the battery pack.

- Make sure the camcorder is off so charging can start.
- The temperature of the battery pack is outside its operating range (approximately 0 40 °C (32 104 °F)). Remove the battery pack, warm it or let it cool down, as necessary, and try charging it again.
- Charge the battery pack in temperatures between approximately 0 $^{\circ}$ C and 40 $^{\circ}$ C (32 $^{\circ}$ F and 104 $^{\circ}$ F).
- The battery pack is faulty. Replace the battery pack.
- The camcorder cannot communicate with the battery pack attached. Battery packs not recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder cannot be charged using this camcorder.
- If you are using a battery pack recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder, there may be a problem with the camcorder or battery pack. Consult a Canon Service Center.

A noise can be heard from the compact power adapter.

A faint sound can be heard while the compact power adapter is connected to a power outlet.
 This is not a malfunction.

The battery pack is exhausted extremely quickly even at normal temperatures.

- The battery may have reached the end of its battery life. Buy a new battery pack.

Recording

Pressing START/STOP will not start recording.

- You cannot record while the camcorder is writing previous recordings onto the memory (while the ACCESS indicator is on or flashing). Wait until the camcorder has finished.
- The memory is full or it already contains the maximum number of scenes (3,999 scenes). Delete some recordings (92, 123) or initialize the memory (36) to free some space.

The point where [START/STOP] was pressed does not match the beginning/end of the recording.

- There is a slight interval between pressing START/STOP and the actual start/end of recording. This is not a malfunction.

The camcorder will not focus.

- Autofocus does not work on the subject. Focus manually (\$\sum 47\$).
- The lens or Instant AF sensor is dirty. Clean the lens or sensor with a soft lens-cleaning cloth (□ 168). Never use tissue paper to clean the lens.

When a subject flits across in front of the lens, the image appears slightly bent.

- This is a phenomenon typical of CMOS image sensors. When a subject crosses very quickly in front of the camcorder, the image may seem slightly warped. This is not a malfunction.

Changing the operating mode between recording (●)/record pause (●II)/playback (►) takes longer than usual.

- When the memory contains a large number of scenes, some operations may take longer than usual. Save your recordings (

127) and initialize the memory (

36).

Movies or photos cannot be recorded properly.

- This may occur as movies and photos are recorded/deleted over time. Save your recordings (\(\subseteq 127 \)) and initialize the memory (\(\supseteq 36 \)).

Cannot record a photo while recording movies.

- You cannot take photos in mode, while the digital zoom is activated (112), while fading in or fading out a scene (128) or while using double slot recording (1236).

After using the camcorder for a long time, it becomes hot.

The camcorder may become hot after using it continuously for long periods of time; this is not
a malfunction. If the camcorder becomes unusually hot or it becomes hot after using it only for
a short while, it may indicate a problem with the camcorder. Consult a Canon Service Center.

Cannot create a new story.

- A memory can contain a maximum of 98 user-created stories. Delete some stories from the gallery (94) or select a different memory (34).

Playback

Cannot copy/move scenes in a story.

- The memory is full. Delete some recordings (QQ 92, 123) to free some space.

Cannot delete a scene.

- You may not be able to delete scenes recorded or edited using another device.

Deleting scenes takes longer than usual.

- When the memory contains a large number of scenes, some operations may take longer than usual. Save your recordings (

127) and initialize the memory (

36).

Cannot capture a video snapshot scene from a movie.

- You cannot capture video snapshot scenes from scenes recorded or edited using another device.
- The memory is full. Delete some recordings (2 92, 123) to free some space.

Troubleshooting

When playing back scenes/slideshow with background music, the music track is not played back correctly.

- This can occur when you transfer the music files to a memory card after repeatedly recording and deleting scenes (fragmented memory). Save your recordings (127) and initialize the memory card (36). Then, transfer the music files first and only then transfer the video files.
- Music tracks will not play back correctly if the connection was interrupted while transferring the music files to a memory card. Delete the music tracks and transfer the music files again.
- The transfer rate of the memory card used is too slow. When playing scenes/a slideshow linked to external audio, the video playback is not correctly linked to the external player.

- The volume of external player may be too low. Try increasing the volume of the external player.

Cannot divide scenes

- You cannot divide scenes recorded or edited using another device.
- The memory is full. Delete some recordings (92, 123) to free some space.

Cannot copy scenes/photos

- You may not be able to copy scenes/photos recorded or edited using another device.

Cannot mark individual scenes/photos in the index screen with a checkmark \checkmark

- You cannot select more than 100 scenes/photos individually. Select the [All Scenes] or [All Photos] option instead of [Select].

Indicators and Onscreen Displays

lights up in red.

- Battery pack is exhausted. Replace or charge the battery pack.

appears on the screen.

- The camcorder cannot communicate with the battery pack attached so the remaining battery time cannot be displayed.

A/B lights up in red.

- A memory card error occurred. Turn off the camcorder. Remove and reinsert the memory card. Initialize the memory card if the display does not change back to normal.
- The memory card is full. Replace the memory card or delete some recordings (☐ 92, 123) to free some space on the memory card.

Even after stopping recording, the ACCESS indicator does not go off.

- The scene is being recorded in the memory. This is not a malfunction.

The red ON/OFF (CHG) indicator flashes rapidly (*** * one flash at 0.5-second intervals).

- Charging has stopped because the compact power adapter or the battery pack is faulty. Consult a Canon Service Center.

The red ON/OFF (CHG) indicator flashes very slowly (** one flash at 2-second intervals).

- The temperature of the battery pack is outside its operating range (approximately 0 40 °C (32 104 °F)). Remove the battery pack, warm it or let it cool down, as necessary, and try charging it again.
- Charge the battery pack in temperatures between approximately 0 $^{\circ}$ C and 40 $^{\circ}$ C (32 $^{\circ}$ F and 104 $^{\circ}$ F).
- The battery pack is damaged. Use a different battery pack.

156

appears on the screen

- The LOCK switch on the Eye-Fi card is set to prevent accidental erasure. Change the position of the LOCK switch.
- An error occurred when trying to access control data on the Eye-Fi card. Turn the camcorder
 off then on again. If the icon appears often, there might be a problem with the Eye-Fi card.
 Contact the card manufacturer's customer care.

Picture and Sound

The screen appears too dark.

- The LCD screen was dimmed. Hold DISP pressed down for 2 seconds to restore the LCD screen to its previous brightness setting.

Screen displays turn on and off repeatedly.

- The battery pack is exhausted. Replace or charge the battery pack.
- Remove the battery pack and reattach it correctly.

Abnormal characters appear on the screen and the camcorder does not operate properly.

 Disconnect the power source and reconnect it after a short time. If the problem still persists, remove the battery pack and disconnect all other power sources from the camcorder. Then, press the RESET button with a pointed object to reset all the camcorder's settings to default values.

Video noise appears on screen.

 Keep a distance between the camcorder and devices that emit strong electromagnetic fields (plasma TVs, cellular phones, etc.).

Horizontal bands appear on the screen.

Viewfinder picture is blurred.

- Adjust the viewfinder with the dioptric adjustment lever (22).

No picture appears on the viewfinder.

- Pull out the viewfinder to activate it.
- No picture will be output to the viewfinder if a cable is connected to the HDMI OUT, COMPONENT OUT or AV OUT/ terminal in playback mode. Remove the cable.

Audio cannot be recorded.

- When using a microphone connected to the MIC terminal, make sure the microphone is turned on. Also, make sure its battery is not exhausted.
- The audio recording level is not set correctly (\$\sum_{\text{69}}\$).

Sound is distorted or is recorded at lower levels.

When recording near loud sounds (such as fireworks, shows or concerts), sound may become
distorted or it may not be recorded at the actual levels. Adjust the audio recording level
manually (\$\sup\$ 69).

There are brief stops in the sound recorded with the optional WM-V1 Wireless Microphone.

- This may occur if the LOCK switch on the Eye-Fi card was set to prevent writing, causing wireless communication to occur while recording. Change the position of the LOCK switch.

The picture is displayed correctly but there is no sound from the built-in speaker.

- Speaker volume is turned off. Adjust the volume.
- If the STV-250N Stereo Video Cable is connected to the camcorder, disconnect it.
- The AV terminal is set to headphone output. Set [] [AV/Headphones] to [AV].

Memory Card and Accessories

Cannot insert the memory card.

- The memory card was not facing the correct direction. Turn the memory card over and insert it.

Cannot record on the memory card.

- The memory card is full. Delete some recordings (\$\sum 92\$, 123) to free some space or replace the memory card.
- Initialize the memory card (\sum 36) when you use it with the camcorder for the first time.
- The LOCK switch on the memory card is set to prevent accidental erasure. Change the position of the LOCK switch.
- A compatible memory card must be used to be able to record movies on a memory card (33).

The wireless controller will not work.

- Set [[Wireless Remote Control] to [On].
- Replace the battery of the wireless controller.

Cannot upload files wirelessly using an Eye-Fi card.

- You may have inserted the Eye-Fi card into memory card slot (A). Insert it into memory card slot (B).
- [F] Discrete [Superscript of the communication] is set to [Off] (appears onscreen). Set it to [Automatic].
- Wireless communication is not available in recording mode or while the optional WM-V1 Wireless Microphone is attached to the camcorder. Set the camcorder to playback mode or remove the WM-V1.
- Opening the LCD panel may help when the wireless connection is not strong enough.
- During wireless transfer, wireless communication may stop when the wireless signal conditions worsen (appears onscreen). Perform wireless transfer in a place with good signal conditions.
- Contact the card manufacturer's customer care.

The wireless communication status icon does not appear

- You may have inserted the Eye-Fi card into memory card slot (A). Insert it into memory card slot (B).

Connections with External Devices

Video noise appears on the TV screen.

 When using the camcorder in a room where a TV is located, keep a distance between the compact power adapter and the power or antenna cables of the TV.

Playback looks fine on the camcorder but there is no image on the TV screen.

- The video input on the TV is not set to the video terminal to which you connected the camcorder. Select the correct video input.
- There will be no video output from the AV OUT terminal while an optional CTC-100 Component Cable is connected to the camcorder's COMPONENT OUT terminal. Disconnect the CTC-100 Component Cable in advance to use the AV OUT terminal.

There is no sound from the TV.

 When connecting the camcorder to an HDTV using an optional CTC-100 Component Cable, make sure to connect also the audio connections using the white and red plugs of the STV-250N Stereo Video Cable.

The camcorder is connected using the supplied High Speed HDMI cable, but there is no picture or sound from the HDTV.

- Disconnect the High Speed HDMI cable and then restore the connection or turn the camcorder off and then on again.

The camcorder is connected using the supplied High Speed HDMI cable, but HDMI-CEC does not work (cannot play back using the TV's remote control).

- Disconnect the High Speed HDMI cable and turn off the camcorder and the TV. After a short while turn them on again and restore the connection.
- [Control for HDMI] is set to [Off]. Set it to [On].
- HDMI-CEC is not activated on the connected TV. Activate this function on the TV.
- Even with TV sets compatible with HDMI-CEC the range of functions available differs depending on the type of TV. Refer to the instruction manual of the connected TV.

The computer does not recognize the camcorder even though the camcorder is connected correctly.

- Disconnect the USB cable and turn off the camcorder. After a short while, turn it on again and restore the connection.
- Connect the camcorder to a different USB port on the computer.

Cannot save photos on my computer

- When the memory contains too many photos (Windows – 2,500 photos or more, Mac OS – 1,000 photos or more), you may not be able to transfer photos to a computer. Try using a card reader to transfer the photos on the memory card. To transfer the photos in the built-in memory, copy them to the memory card in advance (☐ 126).

List of Messages (in alphabetical order)

Accessing the memory card. Do not remove the memory card.

 You opened the double memory card slot cover while the camcorder was accessing the memory card or the camcorder started accessing the memory card as you opened the double memory card slot cover. Do not remove the memory card until this message disappears.

Back up recordings regularly

- This message may appear when you turn on the camcorder. In the event of a malfunction, recordings may be lost so back up your recordings regularly.

Buffer overflow. Recording was stopped.

- The data transfer rate was too high for the memory card in use and the recording was stopped. Replace the memory card with one rated SD Speed Class 2, 4, 6 or 10.
- After repeatedly recording, deleting and editing scenes (fragmented memory), it will take longer to write data on the memory and recording may stop. Save your recordings (127) and initialize the memory (36).

Built-in memory error

- The built-in memory could not be read. Contact a Canon Service Center.

Built-in memory is full

- The built-in memory is full ([☐ End] appears on the screen). Delete some recordings (☐ 92, 123) to free some space. Alternatively, save your recordings (☐ 127) and initialize the built-in memory (☐ 36).

Built-in memory writing error Attempt recovering the data?

This message will appear the next time you turn on the camcorder if power supply was
accidentally interrupted while the camcorder was writing to the memory. Select [Recover] to try
to recover the recordings.

Cannot access the built-in memory

- There is a problem with the built-in memory. Contact a Canon Service Center.

Cannot communicate with the battery pack. Continue using this battery pack?

- You attached a battery pack that is not recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder.
- If you are using a battery pack recommended by Canon for use with this camcorder, there may be a problem with the camcorder or battery pack. Consult a Canon Service Center.

Cannot convert

- Cannot access the memory card. Check the memory card and make sure it is inserted correctly.
- You inserted a MultiMedia Card (MMC) into the camcorder. Use a recommended memory card (33).

Cannot copy

- The total size of the scenes you selected to copy exceeds the available space on the memory card. Delete some recordings on the memory card (92, 123) or reduce the number of scenes to copy.
- The memory card already contains the maximum number of scenes (3,999 scenes). Delete some scenes (☐ 92) to free some space.
- The gallery already contains the maximum number of stories (98 stories in any one given memory). Delete some stories (\$\subseteq\$ 94) to free some space.

Cannot divide the scene. Initialize only using the camcorder.

- The scene could not be divided because the camcorder's internal scene management data log is full. Save your recordings (☐ 127) and initialize the memory (☐ 36). Transfer back the backup files and try dividing the scene again.
- Use the supplied software VideoBrowser to save the scene and divide it on the computer.

Cannot enter standby mode now

- The camcorder cannot enter standby mode if the remaining battery charge is too low. Charge or replace the battery pack (\infty 20).

Cannot load canvas

- The canvas file that was saved on the memory is corrupted.
- Canvas data cannot be read from canvas files created using other devices.

Cannot play back

- You cannot play back scenes that were recorded or edited using another device and then written back to the built-in memory.
- If a memory card was recorded on with another device and then the LOCK switch was set to
 prevent writing, gallery information cannot be accessed correctly so playback is not possible
 from the gallery screen. Play back scenes from the date index screen or change the position of
 the LOCK switch on the memory card.
- There is a problem with the memory. If this message appears often without apparent reason, contact a Canon Service Center.

Cannot play back Cannot access the built-in memory

- There is a problem with the built-in memory. Save your recordings (127) and initialize the built-in memory using the [Complete Initialization] option (36). If the problem persists, contact a Canon Service Center.

Cannot play back Check the memory card

There is a problem with the memory card. Save your recordings (
 127) and initialize the
memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (
 36). If the problem persists, use a
different memory card.

Cannot play the movies in the built-in memory Initialize only using the camcorder

- The camcorder's built-in memory was initialized using a computer. Initialize the built-in memory with this camcorder (36).

Cannot play the movies on this memory card

- Movies cannot be played back from a 64 MB or smaller memory card. Use a recommended memory card (□ 33).

Cannot play the movies on this memory card Initialize only using the camcorder

- The memory card in the camcorder was initialized using a computer. Initialize the memory card with this camcorder (36).

Cannot record

- You cannot capture video snapshot scenes from scenes recorded or edited using another device.
- There is a problem with the memory. If this message appears often without apparent reason, contact a Canon Service Center.

Cannot record Cannot access the built-in memory

- There is a problem with the built-in memory. Save your recordings (\$\sum 127\$) and initialize the built-in memory using the [Complete Initialization] option (\$\sum 36\$). If the problem persists, contact a Canon Service Center.

Cannot record Check the memory card

- There is a problem with the memory card. Save your recordings (\$\sum 127\$) and initialize the memory card using the [Complete Initialization] option (\$\sum 36\$). If the problem persists, use a different memory card.

Cannot record movies in the built-in memory Initialize only using the camcorder

- The camcorder's built-in memory was initialized using a computer. Initialize the built-in memory with this camcorder (36).

Cannot record movies on this memory card

- Movies cannot be recorded on a 64 MB or smaller memory card. Use a recommended memory card (☐ 33).

Cannot record movies on this memory card Initialize only using the camcorder

- The memory card in the camcorder was initialized using a computer. Initialize the memory card with this camcorder (36).

Cannot save the canvas

- Cannot save your [Pens and Stamps] drawings on the memory. Save your recordings (\$\sum 127\$) and initialize the memory (\$\sum 36\$).

Change the battery pack

- Battery pack is exhausted. Replace or charge the battery pack.

Check the memory card

- Cannot access the memory card. Check the memory card and make sure it is inserted correctly.
- A memory card error occurred. The camcorder cannot record or display the image. Try removing and reinserting the memory card, or use a different memory card.
- You inserted a MultiMedia Card (MMC) into the camcorder. Use a recommended memory card (33).
- If after the message disappears, A/B appears in red, perform the following: Turn off the camcorder and remove and reinsert the memory card. If A/B turns back to green you can resume recording/playback. If the problem persists, save your recordings (\(\sum 127\)) and initialize the memory card (\(\sum 36\)).

Do not disconnect the power source. Cannot write data with this connection. To write data to the camcorder, connect the compact power adapter then reconnect the camcorder and computer. Do not disconnect the USB cable unless you first use the computer to safely end the connection.

- The camcorder cannot be operated while it is not being powered by the compact power adapter and is connected to a computer with the supplied USB cable. Memory card is full

- The memory card is full. Delete some recordings (☐ 92, 123) to free some space or replace the memory card.

Handling Precautions

Camcorder

Be sure to observe the following precautions to ensure maximum performance.

- Do not carry the camcorder by the LCD panel. Be careful when closing the LCD panel. When using
 a wrist strap, do not allow the camcorder to swing and hit an object.

- Be careful of heat generated by lighting equipment.
- Do not disassemble the camcorder. If the camcorder does not function properly, consult qualified service personnel.
- Handle the camcorder with care. Do not subject the camcorder to shocks or vibration as this may cause damage.
- When mounting the camcorder on a tripod, make sure that the tripod's fastening screw is shorter than 6.5 mm (0.26 in.). Using other tripods may damage the camcorder.
- When recording movies, try to get a calm, stable picture.

 Excessive camcorder movement while shooting and extensive use of fast zooms and panning can result in jittery scenes. In extreme cases, the playback of such scenes may result in visually induced
 - motion sickness. If you experience such a reaction, stop the playback immediately and take a rest break as necessary.
- Do not insert the supplied stylus pen into the mouth. If swallowed, seek medical assistance immediately.
- Handle the supplied stylus pen with extreme care and keep it out of the reach of children. If mishandled, the stylus pen can present a risk of severe eye injury and even blindness.

Long-term storage

If you do not intend to use the camcorder for a long time, store it in a place free of dust, in low humidity, and at temperatures not higher than 30 °C (86 °F).

Battery Pack

Treat the battery pack with care.

- Keep it away from fire (or it might explode).
- Do not expose the battery pack to temperature higher than 60 °C (140 °F). Do not leave it near a

Disposal

When you delete movies or initialize the memory, only the file allocation table is altered and stored data is not physically erased. Fill it up with unimportant recordings, and then initialize it again using the same option. This makes recovering the original recordings very difficult.

Maintenance/Others

Cleaning

Camcorder Body

 Use a soft, dry cloth to clean the camcorder body. Never use chemically treated cloths or volatile solvents such as paint thinner.

Lens, Viewfinder and Instant AF Sensor

- If the lens surface or Instant AF sensor is dirty, autofocus may not work properly.
- Remove any dust or dirt particles using a non-aerosol type blower brush.
- Use a clean, soft lens-cleaning cloth to gently wipe the lens or viewfinder. Never use tissue paper.

LCD Touch Screen

- Clean the LCD touch screen using a clean, soft lens-cleaning cloth.
- Condensation may form on the surface of the screen when the temperature changes suddenly.
 Wipe it with a soft dry cloth.

Condensation

Moving the camcorder rapidly between hot and cold temperatures may cause condensation (water droplets) to form on its internal surfaces. Stop using the camcorder if condensation is detected. Continued use may damage the camcorder.

Condensation may form in the following cases:

- When the camcorder is moved quickly from cold to warm places
- When the camcorder is left in a humid room
- When a cold room is heated rapidly

To avoid condensation

- Do not expose the camcorder to sudden or extreme changes in temperature.
- Remove the memory card and battery pack. Then, place the camcorder in an airtight plastic bag and let it adjust gradually to temperature changes before removing it from the bag.

When condensation is detected

The precise time required for water droplets to evaporate will vary depending on the location and weather conditions. As a general rule, wait for 2 hours before resuming use of the camcorder.
