- 6 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.





- 2 Remove the screws that secure the base cover to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.

3 Using a plastic scribe, pry the base cover from the palm rest and keyboard assembly.

Replacing the base cover

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Procedure

- 1 Slide the tabs on the base cover into the slots on the computer base and snap the base cover into place.
- 2 Replace the screws that secure the base cover to the computer base.

Removing the battery

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
Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the hard-drive cable from the routing guides on the battery.
- 2 Remove the screws that secure the battery to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.

3 Lift the battery off the palm rest and keyboard assembly.



4 Press and hold the power button for 5 seconds, to ground the system board.

Replacing the battery

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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the battery with the screw holes on the palm rest and keyboard assembly.
- 2 Route the hard-drive cable through the routing guides on the battery.
- **3** Replace the screws that secure the battery to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.

Removing the memory module

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
Prerequisites













Removing the coin-cell battery

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
CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS setup program's settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS setup program's settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

Prerequisites

Procedure

Using a plastic scribe, gently pry the coin-cell battery out of the battery socket on the system board.

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Procedure

With the positive-side facing up, snap the coin-cell battery into the battery socket on the system board.

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

- **3** Align the screw hole on the wireless card with the screw hole on the system board.
- 4 Replace the screw that secures the wireless card to the system board.

5 Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.

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



- **3** Adhere the adhesive tapes that secure the speaker cable on the palm rest and keyboard assembly.
- 4 Connect the speaker cable to the system board.
- 5 Adhere the Mylar to secure the speaker cable to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.
- 6 Slide the touch-pad cable into the connector on the touch pad and press down the connector latch to secure the cable.

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





- 4 Adhere the tapes to secure the screws to the touch pad.
- 5 Slide the touch-pad cable into the touch pad connector and press down the latch to secure the cable.

Removing the processor fan and heat-sink assembly

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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.



CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.



Replacing the processor fan and heat-sink assembly

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Procedure

- 2 In sequential order, (indicated on the heat sink), tighten the captive screws that secure the processor fan and heat-sink assembly to the system board.
- **3** Connect the fan cable to the system board.

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

Removing the system board

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NOTE: Your computer's Service Tag is stored in the system board. You must enter the Service Tag in the BIOS setup program after you replace the system board.



NOTE: Replacing the system board removes any changes you have made to the BIOS using the BIOS setup program. You must make the desired changes again after you replace the system board.



NOTE: Before disconnecting the cables from the system board, note the location of the connectors so that you can reconnect the cables correctly after you replace the system board.









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





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


